Liturgical

<u>Ask Father:</u> I am confused. We are taught about God's infinite capacity for forgiveness, but as Catholics, we are threatened with eternal damnation for a host of reasons including a full confession or missing Mass. Which seems a little harsh.

Thank you for expressing your confusion on why we have to go to Confession and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for our salvation. Not only the Catholic Church, but all world religions have their own ways of preparing their people for eternal life. For instance, Hinduism, the world's ancient religion has its notion of Moksha (Liberation) which is the final stage of man's existence. To achieve Moksha, you have to go through Hinduism's different rituals like bathing in the River Ganges, climbing mountains where a Hindu god or a goddess is believed to be present, and detaching oneself from the material world. To achieve heaven, a Muslim prays five times a day – at dawn, noon, mid-afternoon, sunset, and evening which they do religiously. They also observe a religious pilgrimage to Mecca (Saudi Arabia) called Hajj which is an obligation for every believer. Likewise, all religions teach their adherents different ways of achieving salvation. Our Holy Mother Church recommends we frequent the Sacraments of Confession and Holy Eucharist in order that we may be sanctified and finally saved. Besides, attending Mass on Sundays and on the days of obligation and making your Confession at least once a year are two of the Five Rules of the Catholic Church. Rules are to safeguard our lives. We cannot question an established rule.
