#### Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Ask Father: How did you know you wanted to be a priest?

It is a good question. Thank you! Well, I felt the call to be a priest at the age of 13. At this period, I was an altar server in my parish. My pastor's way of celebrating the Eucharist fascinated me especially when I understood that he was holding the Body and Blood of Jesus in his hands. I said in my mind: "One day, I will become like him!" Besides, I regularly attended CCD classes in my parish. At the end of the CCD academic year, we had annual exams. Almost every year, I stood first or second in my class. There were certificates and prizes for the winners. The certificates described my achievement as a student which were duly signed by our Bishop. However, the prizes were very interesting. They were the little books of the Saints. The biographies of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Francis Xavier, St. Teresa of Lisieux, St. John Bosco, St. Maria Goretti and St. Anthony of Padua, were a few of them. I read all of them with great interest. The lives of the Saints instilled a strong love for Jesus, for the Church, for the Mission and for the souls. When I was 15, I decided: I would be a Priest and a Saint!
