

Third Sunday of Lent

Ask Father: Could you explain why Our Lady of Fatima wants us to pray the Rosary?

It's a great question. Thank you! I always love talking about the Rosary and Our Lady of Fatima. Some years ago, I had an opportunity to visit the Shrine of Fatima in Portugal where Blessed Mother appeared to 3 shepherd children in 1916 and 1917. I stayed over there for 4 days, took part in the candle procession at night, and had a golden chance to hold one of the 4 poles of the statue carrier of Our Lady of Fatima, chanting with thousands of pilgrims, "Ave, Ave, Ave, Maria." The thought of it still gives me goosebumps. Well, coming back to the question, the Virgin appeared to the children in the peak of World War I, where millions of soldiers perished, so many innocent lives were lost, and led the world into a great economic downturn. Besides, the Church was under attack from Communism in Russia and from liberal ideologies. It was during this global crisis the Mother of God intervened, so that the Great War and bloodshed might end. Besides reciting the Rosary, she also recommended the Church to Consecrate Russia to her Immaculate Heart for world peace. Despite all the controversies related to present-day Russia, I should say that Russia in recent times is a full-fledged Christian nation and the Orthodox Church has a strong devotion to the Blessed Mother. In short, Blessed Mother knew that the Holy Rosary is a powerful spiritual weapon against all evils.
