
Greetings in the Holy and Sacred name of our Risen Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ!

I want to begin a pretty deep and important discussion for the next few articles on things post resurrection. Topics such as the birth of the church, giving and receiving the Holy Spirit, gifts to the disciples/apostles, and cover some terms like "age of the apostles" "the church age" "dispensation of grace."

I realize this all likely seems deep, maybe even a bit intimidating, or maybe boring. However, I encourage you to bear with me as we go through all of this. The topics and subjects are foundational to who we are, what we believe, how we came to believe as we do, and how we live out our Christian faith. These topics are our faith foundation! Let me begin with this passage from John 20:

¹⁹On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁰After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord. ²¹Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." ²²And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

This is the "first" time they, the twelve, receive the Holy Spirit. This is before Pentecost! Look it up and study what you find and we'll come back to it next week for more discussion.

YOUR GIFT ENCOURAGES ASPIRING LEADERS WITHIN THE NATIVE AMERICAN COMMUNITY, EDUCATES SEMINARIANS AND EMPOWERS OUTREACH WITHIN THE NATIVE AMERICAN CULTURE.

When The Rev. Roy Hilburn (Waccamaw Siouan tribe) became pastor of the Coharie United Methodist Church in Clinton, North Carolina, nine years ago, there were only eight members.

"[When I arrived], I had the [congregation] envision a circle around the church, a five-mile circle, and I asked them, 'Who could we find within that five-mile circle?' And I told them, within that circle, there would be a diverse [group] of people around us, and if those people were not sitting in our pews, then we were a dying congregation."

Hilburn created a mission statement tailor-made for his congregation called "R.E.A.C.H."

"What we do with R.E.A.C.H. is we want to Restore lives with the proclamation of the word; Exalt God in praise and worship; Actively seek the lost; be Compassionate toward others; and Help those in need," Hilburn says.

The benefits of embracing this concept have been evident in the congregation.

"The folks are on fire and actively seeking the lost. When we hear of needs in the community, we are compassionate to those needs. And we're always looking to help those who are hurting around us," he says.

Contributions to the Native American Ministries Sunday offering help leaders like Hilburn find fresh, new ways to minister to their communities with Christ's love. He credits the seminary scholarship he received with providing the leadership skills he needed. Today, the congregation has grown to 50 people on Sundays.

Hilburn calls the Native American Seminary Scholarship a blessing, adding that he felt honored and respected by the gift, but most importantly, he felt noticed.

"Continue this ministry," he urges, "because it gives Native Americans exposure to keep people sensitive to the fact that we're still here. We're a people who are still present in this time and in this culture."
