Greetings, grace, and peace in the name of Jesus!

Well it is the first Sunday and thus Communion Sunday. I am not physically here with you today; however, I am here with you in spirit. I blessed the Communion elements before we left so that Communion would still be served.

I feel it is important to be consistent when serving and observing traditions such as first Sunday Communion. I also believe and encourage everyone to come and celebrate Communion together.

Speaking of consistency and traditions. You know doing something that is good out of tradition is not a bad thing. I also believe that change for change sake can sometimes be bad as well. For me it is the traditions that I find myself leaning on when I find myself in a time of uncertainty, sorrow, doubt, grief, and ...

Traditions like the Lord's Prayer, old hymns, favorite scripture passages, holidays, family reunions, yearly hunting trips, annual fishing trips, and birthday celebrations. It is traditions like these that I find myself looking back on, reflecting, remembering, and retelling the stories.

Our Bible is filled with traditions and some of which we have brought forward like Holy Communion. As we celebrate Holy Communion we continue a very significant tradition.
