Greetings in the wonderful and blessed name of Jesus!

It is so good to be back! This week I wanted to share a couple points with you about sin and forgiveness.

First how do we define sin? You see that is a loaded question. We don't define sin, God did. We have a manual to consult on what God has deemed to be sin, the penalty, and the way to forgiveness: The Bible. You see our society today seems to have replaced God's word with "whatever." Not to mention, how it seems, if we take a stand with the word of God we can come under great pressure from society. But, let's go back to sin.

Another thing we like to do is make some sins worse than others. Don't get me wrong some sins have greater impact to our society, communities, and families. This is a fact that we know all too well. However, before God all sins are equal. The truth is we "ALL" sin daily in some way. So, if we all sin daily, what are we to do? Repent! Ask God to forgive you in the name of Jesus.

Jesus died to pay the penalty for every sin large or small.

Just because someone sins doesn't mean God loves them less.

Remember "Jesus died for us while we were yet in our sins." So we come to the next situation and that is, if Jesus died for all sins and all we have to do is repent then why should we try to live a good life now? Why not just live it up doing what we want, when we want, any way we want and just before we die repent and slide into heaven safe and sound?
