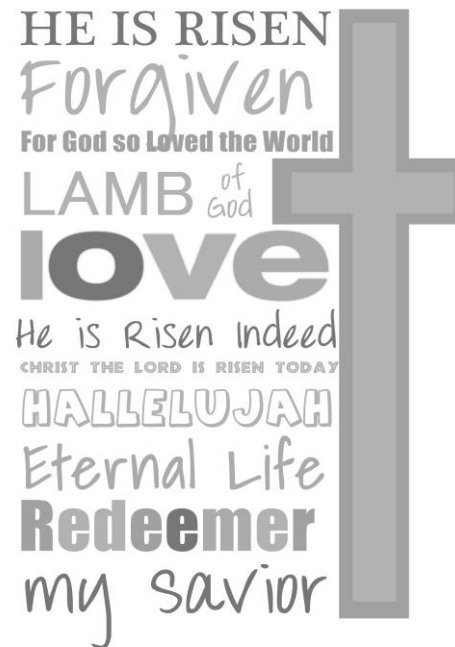

Dear Partners in Mission,

We are now nearing the end of our 10-week journey through the book of Acts. I pray this has been a meaningful for time for you as you read the Bible each day and take time to discuss what you are reading. I know that I have greatly enjoyed the weekly readings and discussion groups and trust many of you have found them to be helpful as well. If you have not been reading along with us, why not join us for the last few weeks of our journey so that we can finish strong?

It is especially fitting that we are taking extra time to read God's word in the season of Lent. Traditionally, Lent was a time of concentrated study and prayer when people prepared for baptism at the Easter Vigil. Today, Lent is less a preparation for baptism and more a renewal of our baptism which we live out each day. It is a time to renounce the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises and intentionally focus on our true identity which is found in Christ alone.

But how will we know and believe our true identity if we do not read Scripture? That is why I cannot stress enough how important it is to have the Truth of God's word in our head and our heart. We need to hear God's word over and over again, because we are constantly hearing so many lies, half-truths and competing truth claims.

Think about how many voices bombard our mind each day: voices of music, voices of advertising, voices of television and movies, voices of social media, voices of the people around us, even the voices of our past can try to creep in and destroy us. How do we filter all those voices? How do we decide what to believe and what not to believe? How do we know what is true and what is a lie? We do it by making God's Word the primary voice in our life—and that can only happen if we read God's word and hear what He says to us on a regular basis. Accordingly, I have invited the congregation to set aside extra time to read the Bible each day as we journey through the book of Acts together. Hopefully, this habit of daily Bible reading will not just be a 10-week event for you, but a life-long journey.

As we continue our journey through Lent, I invite you to release the power of God's Word by reflecting on your true identity in Christ as you read through the attached handout filled with truth from Scripture. Please take some time over the coming weeks to look up all of those verses and read through them, allowing the truth of God's word to soak in. Start to form a habit of turning to these verses and other truths offered in Scripture when you are faced with lies, temptations, or uncertainty. God's Word will empower you to resist temptation, make wise choices, and enable you to better live out your true baptismal ID—discovering WHO you are because of WHOSE you are. For the Truth of God's Word says that you are a dearly loved child of God and inheritor of eternal life, who has been sealed with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

NEWS from COLOMBIA

Early in February we received a letter from Pastor Rocio telling us that San Pedro has decided not to call a pastor at this time. During 2016 they will work to pay off the debt they owe IELCO (the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Colombia) and will have supply pastors from Sunday to Sunday. Most likely IELCO has been paying part of the pastor's salary and they need to show that they are able to manage that. Pastor Rocio will help them the first and fifth Sundays. Pastor Rocio is not taking another call at this time. It appears that she has been hired by IELCO Central Office to coordinate the Ministry of HIV, working Monday to Saturday. She expressed thanks for our prayers for IELCO and for her and sends hugs for all of us and prayers for Pastor Dan. Please continue to remember in prayer our friends in Colombia and for the IELCO Assembly being held in March for the election of the bishop. It is a year since this process started.
