#### **UMCOR HYGIENE KIT**

- One hand towel (15"x25" to 17"x27")
  - No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels
- One washcloth
  - No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels
- One comb
  - Must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth
  - o No pocket combs or picks
  - Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable, but must have at least 6" of teeth
- One toenail of fingernail clipper
  - No emery boards or metal nail files
- Bath size soap (3 oz bar or larger)
  - o No Ivory or Jergen's soap
  - Do not remove from packaging
- One adult toothbrush
  - o Do not remove from packaging
  - Personal advertising acceptable
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4" x 3") i.e., Band-Aid
  - o Common household bandages are acceptable
- One gallon size re-sealable bag
