Bible study: Mondays, 9:15 am & Tuesdays, 12:30 pm



During March and April both Bible studies enjoyed Rev. Adam Hamilton's course *Christianity and World Religions*. Those Hamilton covered were Hinduism, Buddhism, Judaism, Islam and Christianity. The "global religious landscape" was a fascinating mix: 0.2 % Jews; 6.9% Buddhists; 15.1% Hindus; 16% unaffiliated; 24.1% Muslims; 31.2 % Christians. Christians do make up the largest number by far at 2.3 billon people.

Beginning with the story of the Wise Men who followed the star to find the Baby Jesus, Hamilton explained why he personally feels it is important for Christians to try to understand and lovingly accept our neighbors who may not be Christian. The Wise Men after all were "from a country far," surely not Jewish but felt called to see this tiny person they knew would change the world.

Was God trying to tell us in sending the Wise Men that Jesus came for everyone, not just the Jews? Perhaps God was setting an example that God does and we should love and value all people.

Another "wise man" that Hamilton included in his study was a Hindu, Mahatma Ghandi. He is said to have found his inspiration in the Sermon on the Mount. "Don't love only those who love you back. If someone strikes you on the cheek, turn the other cheek." On his office wall was only one religious figure. It was an image of Jesus. Ghandi turned to Jesus' teaching to understand what noninjury might look like as an agent of change. He understood that nonviolence could be an incredibly powerful force. Although Ghandi was Hindu he considered himself a follower of Jesus, who helped him see what living a life of noninjury and sacrificial

love could actually change the world. In the United States Ghandi's approach inspired a young Baptist preacher, Rev. Martin Luther King, in his nonviolent protest that changed the world.

Please see me if you are interested in joining a Bible study. God's word is always fascinating to read and study.

JOIN US FOR A MESSIANIC PASSOVER SEDER! Thursday, April 18th at 5:30pm in Webb Hall

According the Gospels, Jesus' Last Supper was a Passover Seder meal with his disciples. Kathy Cavaliere will once again lead us in a Messianic Passover Seder that combines the traditional Jewish Seder with New Testament references to how Jesus fulfills the symbols and promise of the traditional Seder. The Passover Seder is an annual retelling of the Hebrews escape from slavery in Egypt, led by Moses, recounted in Exodus 12. The Seder includes a responsive telling of the story including traditional songs, traditional Hebrew blessings, the 4 questions asked by a child and answered by the adults, and symbolic foods: 4 small cups of wine (grape juice), greens, salt water, bitter herb, matzo, haroset, and lamb shank. The Seder is broken up by a traditional dinner meal of chicken soup with matzo balls and potato pancakes (prepared by chef Marla Lavitre & sons) with coconut macaroons for dessert (thanks to esteemed baker June Murray). The Seder continues with the Hallel (Praise) to God after the meal and the (4th) cup recognizing the symbolic presence of Elijah, the Old Testament prophet thought to herald the coming of the Messiah, a part that was actually played by John the Baptist.

The Messianic Passover Seder concludes at 6:45pm so we can continue the story in the Sanctuary at the very moving Tenebrae (Maundy Thursday) Service at 7pm. In this way, we experience the Easter story just as Jesus did and get to walk with Him on his journey to the cross. I hope you will join us. Feel free to invite friends or anyone curious about a Passover Seder.

Appalachia Service Project 2019

It's spring! That means that the summer is getting close. The 2019 Youth Team is starting to turn its attention from fundraising to training and the logistics of actually transporting 168 volunteers (and their tools and sleeping bags!) to Appalachia. The big news we're awaiting right now is the announcement of our actual county assignments, expected



April 15. But that doesn't mean fundraising is done! We've raised a little over \$80,000 to date, but have almost \$40,000 left to go. Thank you to everyone who has supported our ASP fundraising events so far, and a special shout-out to those who attended March's ASP Adult Social in Westborough -- it was a great turnout and a great evening, as we tried something a little different. (If you won anything in the silent auction, you should have heard by now. If not, better luck next year!) Watch this space (and our Facebook page) for future events. Thank you for helping us help others.

The 2019 ASP Adult Team is getting serious. We have officially booked our week of service for October 5-12, and already know where we're going -- Jonesville, VA, the same as last year. Currently, we have 16 people signed up, which would be a new record size for this group, but we still have room to add more. If you're interested in more information about a week of service through home repair with ASP, email Jonathan at <u>asp@firstumchurch.com</u>. The Adult Team's first fundraiser, the Rummage Sale is going on as I type this. If the quantity of stuff donated to that is any guide, it's going to be a good year.

Finally, two happy announcements. ASP volunteer centers are run by summer staff members, usually college students as a summer job. They plan repair projects, deliver materials, prepare evening programs, manage the meals and facility -- it's a really big job, and critical to ASP's program. At the same time, because ASP is a resource-constrained charity, it doesn't pay very well, which can make it a difficult job for college students trying to save up for the fall to take. Our ASP group has a long history of members taking ASP jobs after they've graduated from the high school program. So, we are happy to announce that our own Mike Reh has been selected for a position this summer. He will report for staff training and county assignment towards the end of May. Second, to recognize the dedication of staff members and remove some of the financial disincentive to work for ASP, we are announcing the Westborough ASP Staff Scholarship of \$1000, to be awarded to members of our Youth Team who go on to full-time (and then some!) staff jobs with ASP. Mike is our first recipient. Congratulations and good luck, Mike!

God's Love in ACTION

One of the key messages Stephen Ministers receive from our training, which is later reinforced through continuing education studies, is the importance of caring for ourselves while we care for others. With this in mind, our Stephen Ministry team will be going on an overnight retreat in early April to St. Scholastica Priory in Petersham. There, we will have an opportunity to participate in a service and meal with the community of monks and sisters, as well as hearing about Benedictine Prayer. The retreat will also provide us with time away from the distractions of busy lives to listen to God's voice, and to be connected to Him through our bodies (yoga, breathing exercises) and the beauty of the natural world surrounding us.

In our continuing study of "Right Here, Right Now" by Amy G. Ogden, we have been preparing for the retreat by learning about how to practice basic Christian mindfulness skills. In our daily lives, we all have times when we're doing something routine that may not require a lot of focus, such as brushing our teeth, washing dishes, or folding laundry. During those times we can choose to intentionally be present, and to focus on God. Repeating a mantra such as *Maranantha* ("Our Lord, come"), either silently or aloud, can help us stay in the moment. In Psalms 8:4, King David speaks of God being mindful of man. For our relationship with God to flourish, we need to be as intentionally mindful of Him as He is of us.

The Stephen Ministry Team is specifically trained to provide one-to-one care to people who are hurting. The Wesleyan Quadrilateral, Rev. Elizabeth Kubota

Just what is the Wesleyan Quadrilateral you may be wondering. Perhaps you have heard someone drop the phrase but not explain what is meant by it. I have to admit that was me my first week of seminary. Well, I had been Methodist my whole life and had even taken Disciple Bible study. Still the Wesleyan Quadrilateral could have been a geometric shape in the honor of John and Charles Wesley as far as I knew. Once I found the answer to this question it really was not such a difficult thing and even useful in reflecting on Scripture.

According to Methodist historians the theology of Charles Wesley is recorded in his hymns-possibly 6,000 of them. The theology of John Wesley is recorded in his sermons. Historians feel both John and Charles Wesley contributed equally to Methodist theology. Below is a short summary of the four things the Wesleys valued in their Christian reflection, living and preaching.

Scripture: Christians believe that Scripture is the primary source for Christian beliefs. Wesley shared this reverence for Scripture. In it Jesus Christ meets us with redeeming grace. We know that Jesus Christ is the living Word of God whom we trust in life and death.

Tradition: Christians have tried to interpret the truth of the gospel for their time. Tradition is shared common history of Christians. It is the continuing activity of God's Spirit transforming human life. It is God's self-giving love from Jesus Christ.

Experience: We follow Wesley's practice of examining experience for confirmation of God's grace attested in Scripture. Christian experience gives us new eyes to see living truth in Scripture.

Reason: Theology should include the use of reason. By reason we read and interpret Scripture; determine if our Christian witness is clear; ask questions of faith; seek to understand God's action and will.

Scripture, Tradition, Experience and Reason are all ways the Wesleys reflected on their personal theology. But where did the Weselyan Quadrilateral come from? A 20th century theologian, Albert Outler, is credited for organizing Wesleyan theology into the quadrilateral. If you think of a rectangle with Scripture labeling the bottom, Tradition and Experience flanking the sides and Reason across the top, you have the Wesleyan Quadrilateral. So now you may say, what shall we do with our Wesleyan Quadrilateral? In the May Messenger I will share what I did with it in one of my ordination papers.

Design/Build Subcommittee in Contract Negotiations with General Contractor

The Design/Build Subcommittee is in contact negotiations with a contractor to do pre-construction and construction activities with us on our building project, which will create a larger fellowship space outside the sanctuary and make the building handicap accessible. Architect Doug Sacra of Maple Hill Architects is still on track to be completely finished with construction documents by May 1 and we are still on track to break ground in the summer. The GC is leading pre-construction walk-throughs with subcontractors who will bid on our project. If you know of any subcontrac-



tors who would like to bid on this project or possibly provide in-kind work, please contact the office ASAP.

More Financial Support Needed for Our Time to Build

The Fundraising and Finance subcommittees report that we have received 1.735 million in pledges and an additional \$350,000 in un-pledged gifts for a total of \$2,082,000 in committed pledges and un-pledged one-time gifts. The most recent project estimate is \$2,630,000. As a result, we expect to finance \$400,000. To lower our loan payments, we are looking for at least \$120,000 in pledges. AFRICA MISSION: All things Ubumwe (ooboom-way: *unity* in Kinyarwanda)

This will be the first in a series of articles about the Ubumwe Trips: Rwanda, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the people we meet, the places we visit, why we go, etc. For this first installation, I would like to introduce you to Mark Neil!
