Shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child are due on Sunday, November 23rd.

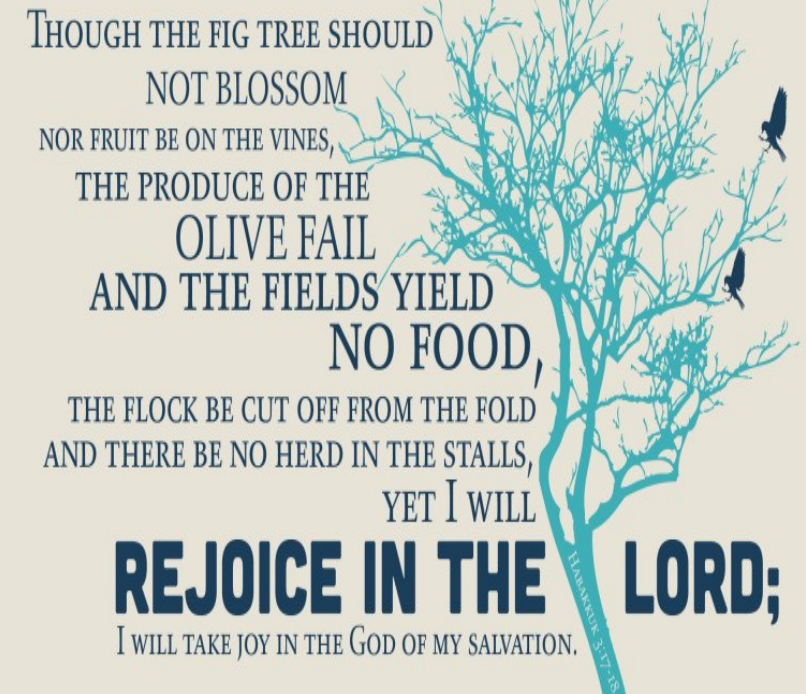

Psalm 13 (ESV) 1 How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? 2 How long must I take counsel in my soul and have sorrow in my heart all the day? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me? 3 Consider and answer me, O Lord my God; light up my eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death, 4 lest my enemy say, “I have prevailed over him,” lest my foes rejoice because I am shaken. 5 But I have trusted in your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in your salvation. 6 I will sing to the Lord, because he has dealt bountifully with me.

Habakkuk 1:1–5 (ESV) 1 The oracle that Habakkuk the prophet saw. 2 O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not hear? Or cry to you “Violence!” and you will not save? 3 Why do you make me see iniquity, and why do you idly look at wrong? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. 4 So the law is paralyzed, and justice never goes forth. For the wicked surround the righteous; so justice goes forth perverted. 5 “Look among the nations, and see; wonder and be astounded. For I am doing a work in your days that you would not believe if told.

Habakkuk 3:17–19 (ESV) 17 Though the fig tree should not blossom, nor fruit be on the vines, the produce of the olive fail and the fields yield no food, the flock be cut off from the fold and there be no herd in the stalls, 18 yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will take joy in the God of my salvation. 19 God, the Lord, is my strength; he makes my feet like the deer’s; he makes me tread on my high places.

.Sermon Notes

The prophecy of Habakkuk was most likely written after the death of the good king _____ and during the reign of the evil king Jehoiakim (609-598 BC).

An Overview of Habakkuk

The first two chapters are a dialogue between the prophet and Yahweh:
Lament: why does God allow injustice to remain in Judah? (1:1-4)
Response: God will use the Chaldeans (Babylonians) to judge Judah (1:5-11)

Lament: how can God use the evil Chaldeans? (1:12-2:1)
Response: God will judge _____ nations (2:2-20)
