
Our annual Christmas Candlelight Service will be held on December 21st at 6:00 PM in the historic sanctuary.

Isaiah 11:1–9 (CSB) — 1 Then a shoot will grow from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots will bear fruit. 2 The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him— a Spirit of wisdom and understanding, a Spirit of counsel and strength, a Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. 3 His delight will be in the fear of the Lord. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, he will not execute justice by what he hears with his ears, 4 but he will judge the poor righteously and execute justice for the oppressed of the land. He will strike the land with a scepter from his mouth, and he will kill the wicked with a command from his lips. 5 Righteousness will be a belt around his hips; faithfulness will be a belt around his waist. 6 The wolf will dwell with the lamb, and the leopard will lie down with the goat. The calf, the young lion, and the fattened calf will be together, and a child will lead them. 7 The cow and the bear will graze, their young ones will lie down together, and the lion will eat straw like cattle. 8 An infant will play beside the cobra's pit, and a toddler will put his hand into a snake's den. 9 They will not harm or destroy each other on my entire holy mountain, for the land will be as full of the knowledge of the Lord as the sea is filled with water.

Jeremiah 23:5–6 (CSB) — 5 "Look, the days are coming"—this is the Lord's declaration— "when I will raise up a Righteous Branch for David. He will reign wisely as king and administer justice and righteousness in the land. 6 In his days Judah will be saved, and Israel will dwell securely. This is the name he will be called: The Lord Is Our Righteousness.

Jeremiah 33:15–16 (CSB) — 15 In those days and at that time I will cause a Righteous Branch to sprout up for David, and he will administer justice and righteousness in the land. 16 In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will dwell securely, and this is what she will be named: The Lord Is Our Righteousness.

Sermon Notes

What is the symbolism of the branch? Literally it refers to a sprout from a tree or bush. Symbolically it refers to the _____ who will be a descendant of David. In some cultures the language of the branch was used to indicate the _____ king. The prophets used the branch as a symbol of _____ and restoration. The true king righteous The last king of Judah was Zedekiah (whose name means "the Lord is righteous"), but Zedekiah was a and foolish king. (2 Kings 24:19). Zedekiah failed to live up to his name. The true king will be righteous because he comes from the Lord (Isaiah 4:2) who himself is righteous (Isaiah 45:21). The true king _____ what is just and righteous Psalm 72:1–2 (CSB) — 1 God, give your justice to the king and your righteousness to the king's son. 2 He will judge your people with righteousness and your afflicted ones with justice. The true king will _____ his people righteous In Jeremiah 23 the will be called "The Lord Is Our Righteousness;" in Jeremiahs 33, the _____ will be called "The Lord Is Our Righteousness."
