The trustees are happy to report that two major repairs have been completed since the last newsletter. First, the second a/c unit and compressor, for the upstairs

class and half of the sanctuary, have been replaced. Secondly, the wiring at the outdoor fuse box has been replace with new wiring and converted to a single breaker box. These improvements will help with the cost of heating and cooling, as well as making sure we do not have any more power outages due to squirrels.


