

# Ask Father: I am confused about how to receive Communion – what is the right way, in the hand or on the tongue?

This is a good question and it is always good to refresh on the proper way to receive Communion. First and foremost, we must be in a state of grace to receive Holy Communion. To do otherwise would be a sacrilege. To be in a state of grace means that we do not have any serious sins that have not been confessed. We see Christ in the 20th Chapter of the Gospel according to John instructing his Apostles (the first clergy of the Church) that whose sins they forgive are forgiven. Therefore, the priests are the ones to whom we must go to have our sins forgiven. I often hear the argument, "but I just feel I need to pray to God and he will forgive me." Unfortunately this is a false argument – Jesus did not tell us to just pray to him and our sins would be forgiven. Instead he told us that we need to go to the priests for sacramental confession. This false argument comes out of the sin of pride – not wanting to say, out loud, in front of another, the sins we have committed. Remember the old saying, "The root of all sin is pride."

So, assuming we have made a good confession and are now in a state of grace, how is it we are to receive Holy Communion? The proper posture for receiving Holy Communion is standing (not kneeling). We are to make a reverent bow (not a genuflection or any other gesture). We may receive Holy Communion on the tongue or in the hands – both being perfectly reverent and in line with the teaching of the Church.

A couple things to remember. When receiving on the tongue – stick out your tongue with an open mouth. Give the priest or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion a target – this will help mitigate the risk of the Sacred Host being dropped on the floor. When receiving in the hands: always use two hands, place the hand you intend to use to put the Host in your mouth on the bottom of the other hand, making a throne for our Lord. Never grab the Host from the priest or Extraordinary Minister. It would be more appropriate to receive on the tongue if you are unable to use two hands to receive as this will also mitigate the risk of dropping the Host.

The Eucharist is the TRUE BODY, BLOOD, SOUL and DIVINITY of Jesus Christ. As such, we must take care to treat it with reverence, care and attention. And we must always humbly follow the teachings of the Church, submitting our will out of obedience.

# The CHOSEN Season 2

No matter where you are at in your journey with Jesus Christ, this TV show is for you! Imagine you could see the life of Jesus through the eyes of the people that walked on earth with him – the disciples, Mary his mother, the Pharisees, the children, those he healed. What would that look like? Now you can experience it! The Chosen is the first-ever-multi-season TV show about the life of Jesus. Created outside of the Hollywood system, The Chosen allows us to see Him through the eyes of those who knew him. The Chosen stays faithful to the Gospels and at the same time tells us a story that is in between the lines of scripture. This T.V. series brings to life those people that are mentioned in the Bible, using the historical context of life at the time of Jesus. The series does not contradict scripture, but instead puts life around it so that we as viewers can imagine, "What was life like with Jesus." It really could have been this way.

We believe that as you encounter the characters in The Chosen each week for the next eight weeks, you will build a new curiosity about the life of Jesus and those that followed him when he walked the earth. This series has the potential to give a better understanding of Jesus as God and man. We will show Season 2, an episode a week for 8 weeks followed by a group discussion. Our hope is that as we encounter the characters in The Chosen, we are able to relate to the them, leading us in a closer relationship with Jesus, our Lord and Savior. The Chosen is a fresh look at the Gospels for those who have been reading the stories for years or for those who are just curious about who Jesus is and was.

Holy Family Parish will present The Chosen starting Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup> through Monday, April 17<sup>th</sup> at the Parish Center at Hillcrest in Minersville from 6pm-8pm. 
