If you kind of think you might want to try, but are still uncertain, pray on it and see where God leads you.

I would like to introduce you to **BeADisciple.com**. It is a wonderful site with MANY online classes you can take at home at your convenience. BeADisciple.com is an online Christian educational experience with roots in Wesleyan theology. It is associated with Southwestern College, a United Methodist school in Kansas. They offer online courses on Aging, Bible Studies, Church History, Creation Care, Grief, Evangelism and more. A few courses offered are "Which Bible to Buy," "How to Study the Bible," "Finding Peace in an Anxious World," "Drawing Nearer to God Through Personal Devotion," and "Biblical Story Telling" just to name a few. The cost runs from \$40 to \$70, depending on the length of course. You will be in class with folk from all over the U.S. There is no set time for class--just when it is convenient for you. I've taken many courses through BeADisciple.com. All have been helpful in deepening my faith. Just take a minute sometime when you're online and check them out. I'm sure something will catch your eye!



# We're Growing!



In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God.

--Acts 1: 1-3

### Dear Fellow Disciples:

We are in a season of growth – both in the natural world in our region and in our liturgical Church Year. Rather than collapsing from exhaustion after Easter – as sometimes happens in local churches -- Jesus' followers have a lot of growing to do after the Resurrection.

The Church has chosen to follow the timeline offered in the set of New Testament books we call Luke-Acts. In this telling, the apostles are instructed by the risen Christ for forty days before the Ascension and gifted with the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, the fiftieth day. From this basis they spread out over the known world to share the Good News of God's love in Christ Jesus.

So, during this Easter Season, we sometimes hear readings in worship from The Acts of the Apostles or from the Gospels about appearances of the risen Christ or, as this year, from The Revelation to John, about how the Resurrection impacts our current lives in deep ways.

There is much attention given to growth in this season in the life of our church. We celebrate Susannah Wesley Day (Festival of the Christian Home) on May 8. We are engaging in a Confirmation Class ending May 29 -- as some of our young disciples journey into deeper faith. We are lifting up May as Safe Sanctuary Month so that we can protect children and youth and all who work with them – in preparation for Vacation Bible School June 26-30. In worship we will get to experience "Music in May" (rather than an Easter Cantata) at 11 a.m. on May 22. This musical presentation focuses on the faith journey from Easter to Pentecost.

Part of the genius of John Wesley, founder of Methodism, probably learned from his mother, Susannah, is his emphasis on spiritual growth. He says that God's grace is at work on us before we even know what it is (Prevenient Grace (from the word for "going ahead of")). It also calls us to a turning around or converting moment (Justifying Grace (which sets us right with God)). In addition, however, he speaks of Sanctifying Grace (from the word for "making holy"). This is the *continuing* work of God's grace on us as we grow and mature as Christians, leading us on to "holiness" or "perfection in love." The opposite of growth, sadly, is fruitless stagnation and death. This is something to be avoided – in both the natural and the spiritual realm.



In February I shared a photo of a flower bed with just the barest hint of shoots peeping up. Then last month I shared another picture of the same bed with plants more fully out of the ground.

With this article I'm sharing two more photos of this same bed. One shows mature plants. The other shows these tulip plants in full bloom. This puts me in mind of the familiar hymn "Come, Ye



Thankful People, Come." Although we associate this hymn with Thanksgiving, it includes this line: "First the blade and then the ear, then the full corn shall appear; Lord of harvest, grain that we wholesome grain and pure may be." Jesus tells the Parable of the Sower (Luke 8: 4-8, 11-15), in which the seed that grows successfully produces a huge harvest.

The purpose of many plants is to produce fruit. In that vein, the Apostle Paul writes of the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5: 22-23): Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. May we continue to grow this Easter Season and beyond, and may our growth in Christian maturity lead us to bear these fruits.

# The Milfred A. and Yvonne A. Bodt Scholarship

Through the generosity of the Bodt family we have a new scholarship to offer for students pursuing a career in service (e.g., health care, law enforcement, public safety, education, Christian ministry, landscape design).

### Applicants must:

- 1. Be a high school senior or graduate.
- 2. Be a member, or the child or legal dependent of a member, of Havre de Grace United Methodist Church.
- 3. Possess a minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- 4. Plan to attend, or be currently enrolled in, a four-year college, community college or vocational program consistent with the scholarship career choices.
- 5. Submit the "Scholarship Application" of the Havre de Grace United Methodist Church, including church activities, by **July 1.**
- 6. Complete a list of activities, if any, that are consistent with the scholarship career choices.
- 7. For first-time applicants, complete a 400-word essay describing the applicant's vocational goals. For subsequent applications, an optional 200-word essay describing progress toward those goals may be submitted.
- 8. If a high school senior, submit their high school transcript and a letter of recommendation from the high school guidance counselor as well as proof of acceptance from the school or program they plan to attend.
- 9. If a high school graduate enrolled in post-high school study, submit a transcript of the most recent semester completed. If transferring to another school, provide proof of acceptance from that school.
- 10. Apply annually. This scholarship does not automatically renew.
- 11. Attend a worship service in which they will be recognized (recipients will be notified of the Scholarship Committee's decision by **August 15**).



This scholarship is in memory of Milfred and Yvonne Bodt. They were married nearly 68 years and were lifelong members of the Havre de Grace United Methodist Church, joining in 1948. Theirs were lives in service.

Milfred was a World War II Navy combat veteran and a career law enforcement professional, spending 25 years of his career as Assistant Security Officer (the highest ranking civilian position) at Bainbridge Naval Training Center, Port

Deposit, Maryland. He served on many church ministries, including 25 years as its Property Committee chair.

Yvonne was a Registered Nurse who spent most of her career at the U.S. Veteran's Hospital at Perry Point, Maryland with specialization in alcohol rehabilitation and psychiatric care. She established the church library, sang in the Senior Choir, served on or chaired every local church committee except the Board of Trustees, was President of the United Methodist Women, Flower Chairperson, Lay Member of Annual Conference and, at the Conference level, Chair of Missions.

# **Alpha's Glory Pregnancy Resource Center**

"Affirming the sanctity of human life, Alpha's Glory supports women, men, and children by providing services and resources for pregnancy, child-rearing, and pregnancy loss, and by compassionately sharing Biblical truths, resulting in long-term life change to the glory of God."



Alpha's Glory in Aberdeen is available to provide encouragement, counseling, parenting classes, and Christian-based support to pregnant women, and expectant dads. Families with babies and older children are provided with formula, diapers, clothing, and other necessities. Limited obstetric ultrasound services have been offered since March 2021. Studies show that many women who view their unborn child via ultrasound choose life.

In 2021, the client advocates gave 27 pregnancy tests, up from 6 last year. Options counseling was offered to all the clients who came in for the test. Of those 27, 18 clients qualified for a free sonogram. The sonographer was able to help the expectant moms to get insurance and doctor appointments. Three women came in abortion-vulnerable and five women were undecided about their pregnancies. After counseling and the sonogram, 7 of the 8 said they were going to carry their babies.

Two outstanding events highlighted the Pregnancy Loss Ministry of Alpha's Glory called The Secret Garden: an annual prayer walk in September and a memorial service for pregnancy loss held in October.

10 volunteers logged in almost 1,400 hours, serving 125 unique clients and their 149 children. There were 94 new clients in 2021, which is 50 percent more than last year. There were 492 client visits, up about 25 percent from 2020. Clients benefitted most from the mentoring and parenting classes via Zoom as well as in the center. Sharing the gospel and spiritual discussions happened more than 300 times, and five clients made professions of faith. Discipling new Christians, as well as those who come to us as believers, goes hand-in-hand with the parenting classes. The counselors reported discussing post abortion healing with 12 women, and abstinence with 28 clients. Homelessness and abuse were also addressed with several of the clients.

If you are interested in participating in the mission of Alpha's Glory, volunteer opportunities include becoming a client advocate, answering the phone, painting, cleaning, or helping organize the Baby Boutique. Groups might make baby blankets, help with fund-raisers, or host a baby shower to help stock the shelves of the Baby Boutique.

# Dealing with Mental Health Issues and Addiction as a Christian

I have read several articles recently about the increase in overdoses in Cecil County and Baltimore City. Mental illness has hurt even more people. Information has been shared about how to access mental health services. This is appropriate given all the stress in our lives today, including the Covid pandemic (with conflict between proponents of science and anti-maskers), the economic hardships that have hit many folk and the struggle for school-kids and teachers to be safe without being overwhelmed.

Anxiety and depression are chronic issues for me – usually under control. I know the drill: Exercise daily (outside if possible), spend time with positive people, watch my diet, take my meds, pray and trust God. So why, if I know how to avoid depression and anxiety, do I still feel out of control?

It's simple. Things are radically different now. There are more things to fear, more people about whom to worry (my children and grandchildren for starters). The positive people who keep me strong are going through the same stuff I am. My church friends aren't there after services to chat when we are worshipping on-line. I feel uncomfortable about calling a friend just to say, "I'm hurting." I need to be the strong one for my family. How am I going to be the helper if I'm in need of help?

Fortunately, my health program includes therapy via phone. I've tried it twice: Last year for six months and, again, this past month. My therapist gently asks me questions, listens to my responses and helps me explore my options – a neutral person who actually listens and offers kind words. If you think a therapist-by-phone might help, give it a try! There is no shame in finding help.

Reading the Bible and using a daily devotional have been a great help. I try to have my devotional time at 8 a.m., but if not, later is OK, too. I am comfortable talking to my daughter, who is going through some hard times herself, and she says, "Mom! Trust God!" This is the real answer! God is here and knows what I need. I believe that I must do my part in dealing with these issues, but God is the healing force. Also, please don't be afraid to share your needs with a Christian friend. Pray together and accept the gift of kindness. Look for folk who seem overwhelmed or drained and ask them how they are doing. Let them know you are here for them.

Many people, feeling out of control, turn to alcohol and drugs to ease their stress. I am thankful that our church supports 12-Step Recovery programs! They can be lifesavers – intervening in both addiction AND mental health issues. If you know ANYONE who is looking for a recovery program, PLEASE call me! I am able to connect you with a caring resource.

We are all in this together.


