Eavesdropping on a Conversation between Q and A

Q: Just who is this guy coming to be our new minister?

A: The Reverend Dr. James G. O'Quinn, but he goes by "Pastor Jim" most of the time.

Q: Where did they find him?

A: Pastor Jim was serving part-time at The West Dinwiddie Charge and part-time as the Director of Congregational Excellence for the James River District.

Q: Why is someone who was just a part-time preacher coming here?

A: That is complicated; see Pastor Jim has been under appointment since 1976. He served 20 years in Pulpit Ministry, 17 years as a Pastoral Counselor, and the last five years he was in Pulpit Ministry and worked out of the James River District office mentoring Pastors and revitalizing churches.

Q: He sounds old. Is this Pastor Jim up to the job?

A: Pastor Jim is sixty-years-old. He served rural, town, suburban, and inner-city churches. He graduated from Birmingham-Southern College, Emory University, and earned his Doctor of Ministry Degree from United Theological Seminary. Pastor Jim is an ordained Elder in the Virginia Conference. Oh, he has a lot of other educational experiences and trainings. Pastor Jim likes to learn new things.

Q: Pastor Jim has diplomas and other things to hang on his wall, but is he a stuffed shirt?

A: Pastor Jim does not take himself too seriously. Just watch his eyes when he talks about his dogs, pick-up truck, or his wife. He will laugh and tease and is sometimes mischievous. But he talks a lot about God's love and grace.

Q: Tell me about his family.

A: Seems he transferred to Virginia from Alabama after marrying his wife back in 1982. Dorothy is also an Ordained Minister and has been under appointment since 1980. She is the Senior Pastor of Duncan Memorial UMC in Ashland. Together, Jim and Dorothy have three grown sons. Their oldest son (Blair) is a Pastor in Chatham, Virginia in the Danville District. Their other two sons (Payne and Vaughn) are severely autistic, and they live in a community placement down in Richmond. Jim's mother (Thelma) is a retired Federal Employee and the widow of a United Methodist Minister. She just moved to Chancellor's Village in May. In fact, Thelma is joining our Church even before Pastor Jim starts with us at Tabernacle.

Q: When do I get to make up my own mind about this new preacher?

A: Well, you will get that opportunity after June 27th, because at Noon on that day Pastor Jim will officially become our Senior Pastor. But it's up to you to like him or not so you better make up your mind soon. He seems to be planning on staying a while.

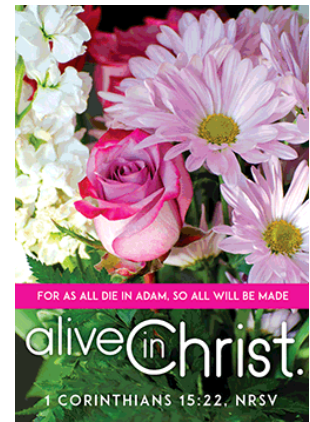
