PRAYER SERVICE – AUGUST 19TH

Acts 27 tells the story of Paul being transported from Crete to Rome to stand trial before Caesar. The seas roared and the ship was tossed around by an angry storm. The sailors brought the lifeboat on board to secure and protect it from the damaging waves. They threw the fishing gear overboard and tied the hull of the ship with ropes to keep it from being destroyed by the pounding water. Everyone but Paul lost hope by the third day of the storm. Paul understood and trusted God to lead them through all dangers and storms. When the ship neared land, the sailors feared it would break apart as it was dashed against the rocks. They dropped anchor to keep the ship steady and prayed all night waiting for daylight (v. 29). We can almost hear their thoughts because we really aren’t much different from those sailors. During the storms in our lives, when our ships are threatened, we say, “I don’t know about this but I know I have to make a plan to get through this.” Paul tells the sailors (and us) that we must stay with the ship to be saved.

The soldiers then cut away the ropes of the boat and let it go. They cut the lifeboat loose which they thought could save them. When the ship neared land, it got caught on a reef and broke apart. Those who could swim jumped out and swam to shore. Others grabbed on to parts of the broken ship and floated to the shore. What a God moment to realize that when we are broken in body, we can ride the waves being sustained by the broken pieces. We can rely on the strength that God gives us.
