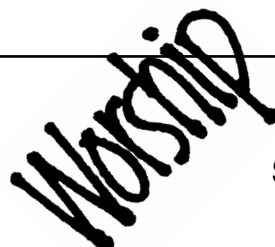
Youth Mission Trip

The Spirit of the LORD is upon me, for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released, that the blind will see, that the oppressed will be set free.

Sometimes it is good to take a look at the big picture. About once a year I like to review the life and mission of our church. This is not a comprehensive summary, but rather a collection of some of our mission projects. I list it only to honor Jesus Christ, and to encourage all of us as we work together in the year ahead.

We are just one church among many churches in Gibson City, and thousands more throughout the United States and the world. Try to fathom how many lives are touched by the Church as a whole to a world in need. This past year our church:

- took 2 offerings to "Imagine No Malaria"
- supported 4 missionaries in the USA, Kenya, Uganda, and Ecuador
- provided Christmas gifts to 39 families (108 children)
- supported 3 Mission Trips to West Virginia (Group Ministries), Kentucky (Appalachia Service Project) and Granite City (Hunger Relief)
- supported Midwest Mission Distribution Center by providing a financial offering and laboring to help with disaster relief and education.
- provided Wednesday night suppers (open to the community)
- received 12 mission "sock" offerings, which supported 12 different projects which included 3 local school programs, senior transportation, a well in Kenya, and Cunningham Children's home
- turned our rally day into a "Poured-Out Church" providing a variety of community service projects
- collected boxes and boxes of supplies and snacks for our troops in Afghanistan

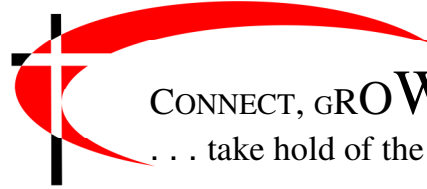

June is a big month for our website. It is going to be completely rebuilt! The current site will be unavailable after June 15th. Please plan to visit the new site on Thursday, June 18th!



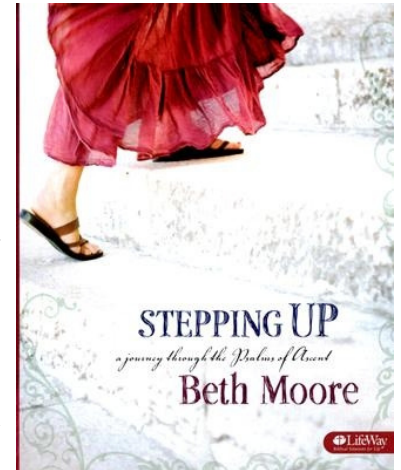
New Bible Study
