150 Years in Mission


Male Missionary leaders of the church failed to share enthusiasm for helping women and children. In most foreign countries, men were not allowed to interact in any way with females. So often, the needs of the hungry, the poor, uneducated, those needing a doctor were not being met—so church women formed their own “missionary societies.” This was not easy. Women of the 1800s weren’t accustomed to speaking in public or working outside the home or making decisions outside their own homes, especially about money. Their place was IN the home!

In early 1869, the Butlers & Parkers, missionaries to India, were on furlough back in Boston. They had seen firsthand the plight of women and girls in India with little to no health care and no educational opportunities. Although the Ladies' Benevolent Society at Tremont Methodist Episcopal Church felt they already had too much to do, they invited those missionary wives to address a special meeting on March 23, 1869. In spite of invitations to 28 Methodist churches, a dark, stormy night, and locked church doors, six ladies finally gained entrance and this handful of women prayed and listened to stories told by the missionary wives. These were “proper” ladies who exercised proper etiquette as they sipped tea with extended pinky fingers, seated sideways on chairs with absolute correct posture! These ladies were aghast as they heard accounts of life in India. Being proper Christian women, they didn't want to upset the men but realized those women in India would perish without medical care. They wanted to be in service to their Lord just as the men. So they decided to deny themselves of some frills. They would “walk the streets of Boston in Calico” rather than more expensive fabric in order to give the savings to their mission project. They closed the meeting with this thought—this is going to be the start of something BIG!

As a result, they organized the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, which in 1972 would become United Methodist Women. They collected two cents a week along with their prayers. Before the end of that year, they had collected enough money to send a female physician and teacher to India.

Clara Swaim, a doctor who had just received her medical degree, & Esabella Thoburn, a teacher and sister of a missionary in India, agreed to answer the call to mission. They were the first single women to be sent as missionaries outside the USA. After a two-month voyage by boat, Esabella Thoburn and Dr. Clara Swaim began their historic mission work in India.

These two women established the first Christian college for women in Asia...and the first hospital for women in Asia...this college and this hospital STILL exist today and are supported by UMW Mission Giving.

This Tremont Church group was the first of eight Women's Missionary Societies founded by our predecessor organizations. Similar women's groups were organized to serve women in the USA who still had few rights and voice.

From these humble beginnings the mission movement has grown to over 800,000 members and spread to serving the under-privileged in over 100 countries around the globe with over \$21 Million. Today we continue the legacy of women organized for mission as United Methodist Women

Over these 150 years, United Methodist Women have evolved to become the largest women's faith-based services and advocating organization in the world, underwriting programs that provide life-changing opportunities for women, children, and youth.

Throughout these 150 years, member have been committed to growing spiritually, developing leaders, participating in education, and advocating for those without resources or voice. Much of UMW focus is on learning of and raising awareness about social, political, and justice issues on behalf of women, children, and youth in the US and around the world.

The early years were focused on mission work providing for women, then focused on empowering them to take charge of their own lives. It's one thing to give someone a fish to eat; it's another to teach that person to fish!

\$101,800.00 **Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund**

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principle (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principle can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of January 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$47,800.15 **Helen Grady Endowment Fund**

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.


