

The History of Auld Lang Syne

The popular song Auld Lang Syne which is sung traditionally to mark the arrival of the New Year at the chime of midnight began as a poem many years ago. Written by Robert Burns in 1788, the poem was set to music and became very well known in many countries around the world.

While it is most recognized as the New Year's Anthem in the United States, it is also sung at funerals, graduations and other ceremonies which recognize the end of one event or chapter and the beginning of another. It is even sung at sporting events!

While different countries have adopted slightly different lyrics or tunes, Auld Lang Syne is widely thought to be about the importance of remembering and celebrating old friendships. In fact, the English translation of Auld Lang Syne is thought to be days gone by, old times, or long, long ago. As we move forward to embrace the possibilities of the New Year, Auld Lang Syne reminds us to hold on to the people that hold special places in our hearts.



STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Budget Results for November 2020

\$364,123.67 Total Budget Money Available November 1, 2020

33,879.20 Money Received in November

- 16,769.90 Money Spent in November

\$381,232.97 Total Budget Money Available November 30, 2020

For the month of November, 2020, the Church Budget received \$17,109.30 more than it spent. For the year, the Church Budget received \$42,774.78 more than it spent.

Major Maintenance & Repair Fund — this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times.

\$30,857.61 Total MM&RF Money Available November 30, 2020

<u>Other Designated Gifts</u> – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principle (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principle can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of November 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$53,207.74 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.
