We are pleased to once again host a shower for the Room- At- The- Inn. This is a non-profit agency responding to the call of Christ to nurture life. They operate housing

and programs for homeless, single, pregnant, and single mothers with children offering them opportunities to have new lives of healthy, hope-filled independence. Residents are allowed to stay up to two years as long as they are in school and/or working. Some of the items needed:

Walmart gift cards (for groceries, clothes and shoes), paper towels/toilet paper/Kleenex, new white/blue towels/washcloths, bleach (Clorox), liquid clothes detergent, liquid fabric softeners/dryer sheets, Dreft detergent, antibacterial soap. One Call Now Phone Messaging System: Last month the church signed up for a new phone messaging system. (Our old phone tree is still operational, albeit a bit contrary at times.) One Call Now by OnSolve utilizes the web to provide access to messaging via texts, email, as well as phone messaging. This system can call a list of twohundred people in about 20 minutes. (Our old system might take five or six hours to call a list of two-hundred people.) It is a new system, and as such it is a bit different. If you receive a message, whether text or phone, at some point within the message you will either hear or see the One Call Now brand. And, you may be given the opportunity to opt out of future messages. This is very different from our old system. Just know that this is part of One Call Now's marketing and promotion. Please contact the church office if you have questions.

A Message from the Trustees

As we return to inside worship, the Trustees would like you all to know of the steps taken to make our worship space as safe as possible. In addition to protocols like - temperature checks, wearing masks, asking screening questions, and following traffic flow guidelines in and out of our sanctuary, the Trustees researched air filtration systems.

During our shut-down the iWave by Nu-Calgon system was installed in the return air ductwork system serving the sanctuary. conditioning units serving the sanctuary have been programmed to continually recirculate air. In the recirculation process, the iWave system works to inactivate 99.4% of Covid 19 virus within 30 minutes and 84% within only 10 minutes. The iWave unit also reduces odors, as well as reduces - STAPH, MRSA, E. COLI, C. DIFF, TB, Legionella Pneumophila and Mold Spores.

The iWave air cleaner is one part of the total commitment to make our place of worship safe for all who enter.

A Note from the Treasurer...

Payroll Protection Program

On April 6th, 2020, we filed with Bank of America for the Small Business Administration's Payroll Protection Program. On May 4th we received a loan of \$23,096. I have spent approximately 80 hours researching & reading the 200+ pages of information, listening to approximately 10 webinars, and preparing the application and supporting documentation.

We were advised by district, conference, Wespath, and CapenCrouse, largest CPA firm in America dealing with non-profits and specializing in churches, to overspend the PPP loan by approximately 20% in order to accommodate for any disallowed expenses. The entire process was an ever-moving target of rules and regulations, changing weekly. The experience was much like crossing a bridge while it's being built. We were also advised to delay filing for loan forgiveness while the rules for forgiveness and documentation were being changed.

On February 22, 2021, we were able to file for loan forgiveness, which could be up to a 90-day process between Bank of America and the Small Business Administration. The past 12 months have been extremely stressful as I wrestled with the application/documentation and not having a live contact person at the bank as an advisor. The years of imprisonment I personally faced for any error was quite intimidating! On the other hand, at my age just how many years would I have to serve in prison?

On March 26, 2021, I received notification that our entire loan of \$23,096 was forgiven; no longer a loan, but now a grant. Since this process has happened in two years, the \$4,569.50 we overspend will affect the 2021 budget.

\$405,795.43 Total Budget Money Available March 31, 2021

For the month of March, 2021, the Church Budget spent \$6,311.44 more than it received. For the year, the Church Budget spent \$1,747.58 more than it spent.

Major Maintenance & Repair Fund — this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times.

<u>Other Designated Gifts</u> – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principle (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principle can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of January 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$59,706.91 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.
