The Project AGAPE staff in Armenia is diligently working to relocate its

destroyed offices and warehouse in order to serve the thousands displaced by the war between Armenia and Azerbaijan that occurred last year. The transition to new facilities, along with the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, has hindered partners' ability to distribute donations as they would normally. Thus, Nara Melkonyan, the in-country Director, informed us the Project Agape staff will not be ready to receive shipments of Christmas shoeboxes this year. The Mission Continued top of page 4

\$405,921.71 Total Budget Money Available May 31, 2021

For the month of May, 2021, the Church Budget spent \$2,089.44 more than it received. For the year, the Church Budget spent \$1,621.30 more than it received.

Major Maintenance & Repair Fund — this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times.

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principle (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principle can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of January 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$60,353.14 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.


