From the Pastor's Desk

"You Are What You Eat" (1 Corinthians 10:31)

The holiday season is already upon us; on the 25th we celebrate Thanksgiving and a month later we celebrate our Savior's Birth at Christmas which involves, in most cases, a lot of food. And, some will call those 'cheat days' (a great reason/excuse to eat whatever we want to) but too much of a good thing is, well, too much of a good thing most of the time. Yet, as the holidays approach it can remind us that in our walk with the Lord, what we consume, and how much we consume, builds us, shapes us, and even can dictate who we are and how we live and make choices.

When Anna-Grace was a baby, she loved her baby food carrots and the sweet potatoes to the point it could be a struggle to get her to eat some of her other baby foods. STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Budget Results for September 2021

\$410,570.03 Total Budget Money Available September 1, 2021

17,570.16 Money Received in September

- 21,683.61 Money Spent in September

\$406.456.58 Total Budget Money Available September 30, 2021

For the month of September, 2021, the Church Budget spent \$4,113.45 more than it received. For the year, the Church Budget spent \$1,086.43 more than it spent.

Major Maintenance & Repair Fund – this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times.

<u>Other Designated Gifts</u> – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principal (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principal can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of January 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$63,572.72 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.
