Chrismon Tree

Each year in December Bethlehem is decorated with wreaths on the doors, a nativity scene outside, candles in the windows, and the Chrismon Tree standing prominently at the front of the sanctuary. Members of the congregation usually agree that the tree is beautiful.

The first Chrismon tree was at the Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, Virginia in 1957. The ornaments were made by a lady named Frances Kipps Spencer. She loved Christmas but thought that decorated trees had no place in a church.

As she tried to decorate the tree in a suitable way she referred back to The Book of Signs by Rudolph Koch. One section on early Christian symbols caught her eye. The symbols were ones that early Christians used to identify themselves, to designate meeting places, and to transmit their faith and beliefs. Ms. Spencer decided that by using these designs to decorate the tree, she would be using the real reason we celebrate Christmas. She chose the word Chrismon to name the ornaments. The word is a combination of Christ and monogram, (meaning symbol). All Chrismons are white and gold (for his majesty) with an occasional spot of color allowed for a specific purpose. They can be made with any material, but are now usually made of beads.

A Chrismon Tree was first used at Bethlehem when Kenneth Moore was pastor (1976-'80). His wife, Sarah Helen, had some experience with Chrismons at other churches. The Arlene Stokes Guild began meeting together to make ornaments for a tree at Bethlehem.

New ornaments are made by Doris Reynolds. She can tell you more about the time it takes to make these ornaments and the meaning of each one. Take a closer look at the tree this year. Doris and the others who started this tradition deserve a big thanks!

\$395,122.19 Total Budget Money Available October 31, 2021

For the month of October, 2021, the Church Budget spent \$11,334.39 more than it received. For the year, the Church Budget spent \$12,420.82 more than it received.

Major Maintenance & Repair Fund – this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times.

<u>Other Designated Gifts</u> – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principal (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principal can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of January 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$62,988.44 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.
