Basic Schedule:

Monday, June 11 – **Leave at 3:00am from the activities bldg.** (We want to be loaded and ready to roll at 3:00. You can start arriving as early as 2:30am.)

Tuesday-Thursday – Full Days at MFUGE

Friday – Leave Ridgecrest at 11:00am. Stop at Sliding Rock. Arrive back in Clinton late.

Sliding rock is a natural water slide near Brevard, NC. You will have a blast and freeze your tail off in the cold water. Plan to bring travel clothes to change into after you finish sliding. Changing rooms are available.

Need from you: FUGE Medical Release Form (included in this letter), FBC Medical Form if not already updated for 2018, Balance for Camp if you still owe any money (if unsure, email Kenny at kenny.stanteen@fbclinton.org).

What to Bring:

- Linens, towels, pillows, blankets (
 - All guys and most of the girls will be sleeping on twin size bunk beds. Some girls will have a queen size bed. Linens provided for the queen size bed only.
- Water bottle you can refill and carry with you
- Closed-toe, closed-heel shoes
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as toothbrush and shampoo
- Sun protection
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)
- Money for traveling meals (lunch going, lunch and supper on return trip)
- Summer clothing (see dress code)
- MEGA Relay is a throwback to the 70s. Bring some 70s attire to wear.
- Modest swimsuit for Sliding Rock

What not to Bring:

- Alcohol, tobacco, e-cigarettes, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon
- We recommend no iPads, iPods, PlayStation portables or other gaming devices. If students do bring cell phones or other electronics, they are not to be out and in use during programming elements: morning celebration, Bible study, worship, night life, and ministry tracks.
- Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, shaving cream, silly string, etc. Pranks are not allowed at camp.

Dress Code:

Students are NOT to pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs;
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person;
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations;
- Has spaghetti/small straps or open back, except for sleepwear;
- Is excessively short or tight fitting.

While at camp, we ask that students:

- Wear modest shorts (when hands are extended to the back or the front, fingertips must touch fabric).
- Sleeveless shirts and tank tops are now allowed during daytime activities. Shirts with spaghetti straps, open backs or excessive armpit cutouts which expose torso and undergarments are NOT allowed.
- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes while on ministry sites and during Mega Relay.
- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt, if participating in water activities.
- Wear modest shorts, pants, jeans, or dresses for worship. Dresses with spaghetti or small straps, open backs, and excessively short lengths are unacceptable (when hands are extended to the back or the front, fingertips must touch fabric). Modest sleeveless tops are allowed in worship.
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.) or wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom.
