A Non-Traditional Lent:

Witness at the Cross

This year, for the six weeks leading to Easter, March 6th –April 10th our worship experience and the sermon in particular will focus on those who were at the cross when Jesus was crucified. The author of the book that is guiding my thoughts is Amy-Jill Levine, a New Testament scholar and author whose work I have relied on previously.

My hope is the milder weather and the decreasing threat of Covid-19 will encourage many of you to reconnect with worship and make being in person to worship God, and grow your faith a priority. We have purchased a DVD which compliments the sermon series and which will offer the possibility of a more in depth small group study. A group could use this on Sunday morning or anytime of your choice during the week. Each video lasts just under 13 minutes. A time of welcome and gathering, an opening prayer, watching the video and a time of discussion could easily be accomplished in a 45-60 minute time period. Clarity in the Clutter

Life is inching closer to what might feel like normal. Well, sort of. Or at least it was until war broke out in Ukraine. Russia now seems intent on invading and killing until they gain the control they want. The images and stories coming out of Ukraine are so sad, so frustrating. I wish it could just end...now. I wish no one else would be hurt or killed. I wish somehow the president of Russia (I refuse to speak his name) would suddenly come to his senses and realize the harm he is senselessly causing.

Oh, God, make it stop.

The thing is that is not how God works. And at times, times like this, an autocratic dictator choosing to use power to increase *his* power with no regard to human suffering is both hard to understand and difficult to tolerate. That is when we turn to God and trust those with the training and skill God has gifted them with, to stop the assault. It may not stop quickly. Many will be injured and there will be many lives loss. God will be with us all in the struggle. May we move closer to God, and be comforted by God's tangible presence.

Today, I share with you a favorite theologian and author, Walter Brueggemann, author of *Awed to Heaven, Rooted in Earth.* His collection of prayerful poems, or poetic prayers, if you prefer are always helpful to me.

Larger Than Fear

We do not really know about running and hiding.
We do not have any real sense, ourselves, of being under assault, for we live privileged, safe lives, learning in a garden near paradise.

Nonetheless the fear and the prayer

live close beneath the surface...

enemies we cannot see,

old threats lingering unresolved from childhood,

wild stirrings in the night we cannot control.

And then we line out our imperative petitions,

frantic...at least anxious;

fearful...at least bewildered;

Turning to you, only you, you...nowhere else.

In the midst of our anxiety, confidence wells up,

In our present stress, old well-being echoes.

We speak and the world turns confident and grateful,

not because we believe our own words,

but because of your presence,

your powerful, bold, reliable presence

looms large,

larger than fear,

larger than anxiety,

large enough...and in our small vulnerability, we give thanks.

Amen.

May we understand we have enough. It is not about us or our leaders. It is not about them or their leaders. God will be with us... That is enough.

Dillons Community Rewards Program

Did you know Shawnee Heights United Methodist Church is enrolled in the Dillons Community Rewards Program? It is the perfect partner for you and Shawnee Heights UMC allowing you to easily donate to the church just by doing your normal grocery shopping.

The Community Rewards program allows organization members/supporters link their Dillons Plus cards (shopper cards) with Shawnee Heights United Methodist Church. Based on all qualifying purchases made using your Dillon's Plus card, Dillons makes a donation quarterly back to the church.

The Dillons member number for Shawnee Heights United Methodist Church is #XJ342. If you have previously designated SHUMC as your partner there should be nothing for you to do. It is good to login to your account on the Dillons website and visit the Community Rewards page. Once you have designated Shawnee Heights United Methodist Church as your partner it will remain this way until you change to another partner.

If you don't currently have a Dillons online account - follow all Steps #1 - #7 below. If you already have a Dillons online account - Skip down to Step #4 (Enrolling Your Plus Card in Community Rewards)

HOW TO CREATE AN ACCOUNT:

Step 1: Visit the Dillons website: www.dillons.com/communityrewards - Click on CREATE AN ACCOUNT.

Step 2: Fill out the required information: Email address; Create Password; Zip Code and Preferred Store. When complete, click Create Account at bottom of screen. (Passwords must be 6-12 characters long; must have at least 1 letter & 1 number; Special characters may be used.)

Step 3: Add your Dillons Plus Shoppers Card to your account. Enter the 10-digit number from the back of your Plus Shoppers card or your phone number (Alt-ID) in the field provided. Enter the last name you used when you filled out the application for your card.

RE-ENROLLING YOUR PLUS CARD IN COMMUNITY REWARDS:

Step 4: SIGN IN using your new or existing online account; Click on ENROLL NOW

Step 5: Enter SHAWNEE HEIGHTS UNITED METHODIST CHURCH in the search bar, please make sure it has number **#XJ342** in the number column.

Step 6: Select Shawnee Heights United Methodist Church, Tecumseh, KS - #86711; Click ENROLL to save.

Step 7: Confirm your enrollment was completed successfully. (You can modify your enrollment at any time by logging into your online account.)
