



Thanksgiving as a Spiritual Discipline

It's an invitation to practice thanksgiving as a spiritual discipline - a way of seeing and living that reorients our hearts toward God, even when circumstances are difficult.

Practicing thanksgiving means intentionally naming God's gifts, even the small ones. It means pausing long enough to recognize that every breath, every meal, every relationship, every new morning is evidence of grace. When we make gratitude a habit rather than a reaction, it transforms our perspective. We begin to notice abundance where we once saw scarcity. We start to trust God's provision more deeply. And that trust becomes the fertile soil where generosity grows.

As you enter this season of thanksgiving, I encourage you to make space for a daily practice of gratitude - perhaps writing down three things each day for which you're thankful or saying a prayer of thanks before bed. Over time, you may find that thanksgiving doesn't just change your mood; it changes your heart.

Worship Update

As I write this, my heart is breaking for people everywhere who are suffering in so many ways: separated or estranged from families, on furlough with no pay, uncertain of future employment, unable to navigate a host of complicated systems like health care and finances, living with serious illness facing death, or grieving a loss, be it of loved ones or another important part of their life that is no more. Suffering confronts each of us at some time or another. This month during worship, we commemorate events that acknowledge the reality of suffering, but take comfort in the context of thanksgiving to God and the hope we find in our faith.

All Saints: a time our church collectively remembers who have died during the past year, but whose presence during their lives blessed us. We suffer their absence, even though they are now with the Lord. We call this celebration All Saints - not because these are people who have been canonized following an exhaustive post-mortem review of their lives and deeds, but because they shared their love and faith with us, generously providing insight and encouragement and reassurance of God's presence in a world that isn't always kind. The church as a whole, and our church in particular, rejoices in our frequent encounters with these unassuming saints. Without them, many of us would have given up hope long ago. So we read their names and light candles in their honor. (Who are the saints who have touched you and given you the strength to move on when suffering has tested you to the breaking point?)

Thanksgiving: a self-explanatory word that in our country evokes the season of turkey, mashed potatoes, family, football, deer hunting, and (locally!) the annual Parade of Homes. What a step up from the Puritan settlers who suffered sickness, death and starvation during their first winter in the "New World"! Nevertheless, those who lived and struggled through the painful times gave thanks to God for what they had, and rejoiced even more when God provided compassionate local native peoples who helped them with food and survival skills. They faced suffering with hope, firmly grounded in faith.
