

### **Worship Update**

I think I've finally come to terms with the fact that the liturgical year begins as the secular year ends! December has arrived, meaning budgets and semesters and calendars are being renewed or replaced. At the same time, the church year has come full circle from last December to another Advent (when we celebrate the hope and promise of the coming Messiah) and Christmas! We have been here many times before, with similar songs and Scriptures and family traditions. But each year brings new insights, struggles, opportunities, joys and sorrows that affect our celebrations and understanding of our faith.

This year a couple unexpected ideas have been on my mind. The first comes from "Seussical", a lively musical that incorporates the plots of several Dr. Seuss stories (Pastor Dan will appreciate this!). I've attended 3 different productions during the past year, from elementary to high school to community theatre, and each time I have been drawn to one timely message from Horton the Elephant: "A person's a person, no matter how small ..." Why is this so hard for our world to figure out?

The second comes from a recent radio interview featuring Diana Butler Bass, a theologian and author who recently published a book based on meditations she wrote in response to her lectionary readings during the Covid shutdown.

She ponders the unique lessons of each liturgical year, and suggests that the message and purpose of Christian faith have been lost and its reputation damaged. People are suffering cruelty and injustice from those who claim to be Christian, ignoring Jesus' command to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and soul and mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

Advent and Christmas are dear to my heart. The music and the decorations and special family times lift my spirit during dark winter days, and don't get me started on cookies! But Dr. Seuss and Diana Butler Bass remind me that while traditions are important and celebrating Jesus' birth renews our sense of peace, love, hope and joy, it is in sharing Jesus with the world (think of Sally Friedlander and "Bethlehem Revisited"!) that we show we value each person, "no matter how small", and that we live our faith with compassion and grace throughout the year.

"O come, O come Emmanuel ..." Christmas blessings to all!
