Valentine's Day isn't just for school children and sweethearts. Loving parents and grandparents can give kids these life-changing gifts during Feb. and beyond.


Acceptance: Say and show that you love children for who they are. Give this gift with a kiss.





VOTER REGISTRATION

If you are not registered in the City of Hudson or you now have a different name or different address than what is listed on the **My Vote Wisconsin website**, you will need to register or re-register. This is the case even if you move to a different apartment in the same building or complex. The deadline for registering at the Clerk's office is 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before any election. There is no voter registration on the day before the election. You may also register to vote on any Election Day at the polls. When Covid arrived more than 5 years ago, Hudson UMC, along with churches all over the country, lost something we often take for granted: the privilege of gathering in person for worship. But thanks to the efforts of Reverend Dr. Dawn Jeffer-Ramstad, videographer John Ramstad and a brave cadre of masked musicians (Mary Post, LeAnn Stein, Heather Tank, Joanne Campbell, Kim Campbell, Randy Dahle, Rick Hagar, Becca Hallock-Wolff, Roger Roenfanz, Larry Sederstrom, Deb Simonson, and Darci Strutt McQuiston, myself, – hope I didn’t miss anyone!), we entered the adventure of online worship – not ideal, but a great comfort when we could not be at church, as well as an unexpected new option for folks who had often been unable to attend in person due to distance or physical challenges.

The Lord stuck with us. We've gradually returned to in-person worship, but have maintained our online service, and now, after almost 5 years of regular recording, we have entered the next phase of online worship at Hudson UMC! As of January 11, we've officially replaced our recorded service with livestreaming. The Worship Team appreciates the efforts of Pastor Dan and the ALB to move forward with this new worship opportunity – from installing the necessary equipment to learning how to create an account online to recruiting volunteers for livestream training (including Dave and Kathy O'Brien-Schroeder, Pastor Dan Fahs, Steve Close, Gabe Overlee, and Daryl Simonson).

You may be saying, "Not another change!" I understand your concern, but be assured it's for the better, even if it will require some patience, both with all who have worked on this and with yourselves! We are taking baby steps and don't expect everything to be perfect right away; it will take time and tweaking with camera angles and microphone levels in order to reach consistent, high-quality livestreamed worship. Also, if you're used to "previewing" Sunday worship, that option is no longer available because the link for livestreaming won't be active until just before worship begins in real time – aka live! We will be streaming the 10:30 service, so early birds will need to plan accordingly.

I hope this gives you a better idea of what's new in worship at HUMC. If you have any questions, comments or concerns, please don't hesitate to speak with Pastor Dan or Kathy OBS in the office, or any of us involved with worship leadership. Our prayer is that anyone who participates in worship, whether in person or online, will feel welcome and engaged, grow in faith, and seek to further the kingdom of God on earth.
