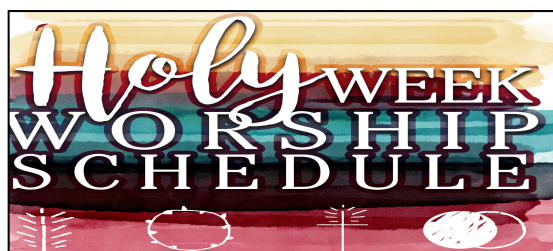

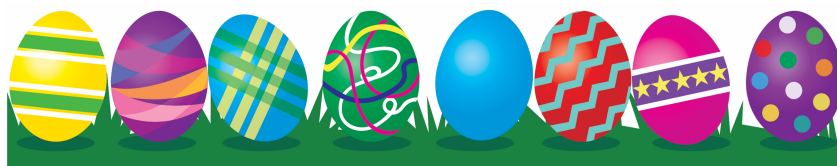

Information on the Upcoming Vote on Becoming a Reconciling Church

It's official. The Reconciliation Inquiry Committee has been given the green light from the church board (ALB) to hold a final vote on becoming a Reconciled Church, an affirming church. If 75% of our voting members agree we will become a reconciling church and join a UMC organization called the Reconciling Ministry Network (RMN).

OFFICIAL RECONCILED CHURCH VOTE: April 19 and April 26 (2 Sundays) 8am-noon
(online voting will be available for those not able to cast an in person vote from April 19-26th.
Email Margie Close at smclose@comcast.net to be sent a ballot)

The following is a statement that all churches who are reconciling and join RMN adhere to. Our vote will be to accept this statement for our church and join the RMN.

"We celebrate God's gift of diversity and value the wholeness made possible in community equally shared and shepherded by all. We welcome and affirm people of every gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation, who are also of every age, race, ethnicity, physical and mental ability, level of education, and family structure, and of every economic, immigration, marital, and social status, and so much more. We acknowledge that we live in a world of profound social, economic, and political inequities. As followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to the pursuit of justice and pledge to journey in solidarity with all who are marginalized and oppressed.

Why should we become a Reconciling Church and join RMN?

- To extend God's fully inclusive love and unconditional welcome
- So our current neighbors, new residents and out of town guests can find us

Being listed on the RMN (Reconciling Ministries Network) website allows visitors to find you when searching by city or state. Because of the harm the institutional church has done to LGBTQ+ persons, visiting a church is a risk that requires great courage. No matter how affirming a church may be on the inside, LGBTQ+ friends and allies won't experience that affirmation if it's not first expressed through an intentional commitment and an outward invitation. It's important to place our welcome mats on the outside of the building, not just the inside.

Worship Update

We begin April with the darkness of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, but then Resurrection Day arrives overcoming that darkness with the light and life of Christ!

Happy Easter! Christ is risen – He is risen, indeed!

Finding joy and hope has been a challenge in recent months. A song from the 60’s has been rolling around in my head recently: “Little Boxes” – perhaps you remember it. The lyrics criticize post-war conformity, from university education to golf to living in houses “made of ticky-tacky” that “all look just the same”. Our world is so amazingly diverse, and yet society too often dictates that belonging means conformity, whether outwardly, like clothing or hairstyles; attitudinally, like music preference or political affiliation; or even more intimately, like family structure or religious affiliation.

In Romans 12:2-3, the Apostle Paul advises us to “not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God’s will is – his good, pleasing and perfect will. For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you.”

The only “conformity” for Christians then is to reject the world’s “little boxes”, and to seek the will of God, which Christ summarized in two great commandments: to love the Lord our God with all our mind and heart and strength, and love our neighbors as ourselves, no matter where they come from or what they look like. God invites everyone, not just to a religious affiliation, but to a spiritual transformation whose fruit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5:22). Everyone – individuals with unique, God-given gifts, complete with individual quirks and imperfections – transformed by the Spirit, accepted and loved, belonging without being imprisoned in those “little boxes.”

He is risen – Allelulia!

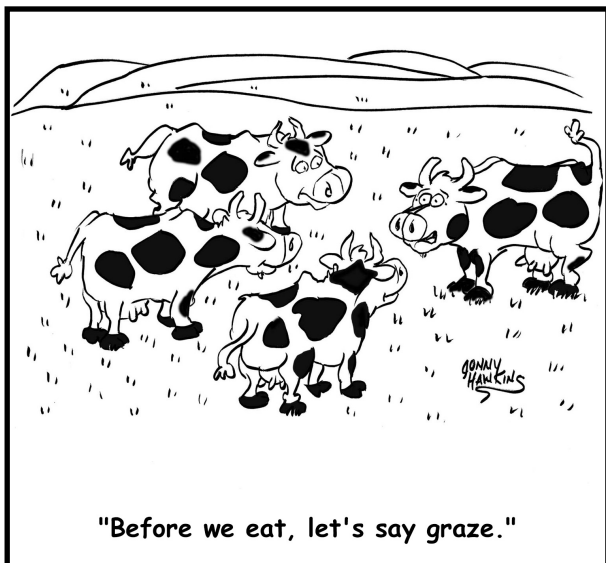
