**God Satisfies What We Are Asking Based On Our Compliance With His Demands**

The interacting definitions and vocabulary words for our text this month are:

Asking: to request for something

Comply: to meet the terms or act in accordance to

Demand: God's commands and God's orders

The Bible expresses to the believers in Christ in Matthew 7: 7 - 8, **“Ask and it shall be given you, seek and ye shall find, knock and it shall be opened unto you. For every one that asketh receiveth and he that seeketh findeth, and to him that knocketh, it shall be opened”**.

But notice that there are three emerging concepts involved in interacting with God's proposition here in Matthew 7:7-8. Before we can receive the results of what we are requiring from God, let's look at a brief analogy and purpose for the satisfaction of what the believers are asking from God in the following procedures:

1. *Acting upon what you're asking from God.* With the impregnating of your faith, you can focus on the future materialization of what has been requested of God while remembering God's instructions that's offered to His people through His word. Hebrew 11: 1 says (line 1) **“Now faith is the substance of the accumulating things that we are expecting and seeking from God”**.
2. *Implementing (putting into operation) the requirements from God's word that is attached to your proposition from God.* This is based on the fact that networking with God's proposition will ensure the believers of a future reality of what they're asking from God. Just as it did with Abraham because that he complied with God's requirements and he viewed the outcome of his desires from God.
3. *Submission and team working with God's Demand (God's asking of one).* The believer meeting God's obligations will satisfy God's proposal and because of God's satisfaction, He will present to His people an unveiling of what has been petitioned from Him. Let me offer confirmation to this statement that's relating to “meeting God's requirements which gives pleasure to God's Nature and prompts God to reimburse your application that's before Him” Let us review some characters of the Bible who requested God to provide and met the responsibilities of God's demand.

In the book of Acts 1:4, we'll notice where God commanded His disciples to adhere to what He was asking of them, so that they would be compensated for their need of the Holy Ghost. The Apostles brought themselves under subjection, interacted with God's proposition and received full proof of what they were craving from God. (Ref. - Acts 2: 1-2)

By utilizing this formula, the people of God can be confident that what they are asking from God will produce a rewarding and pleasing confirmation from God.
