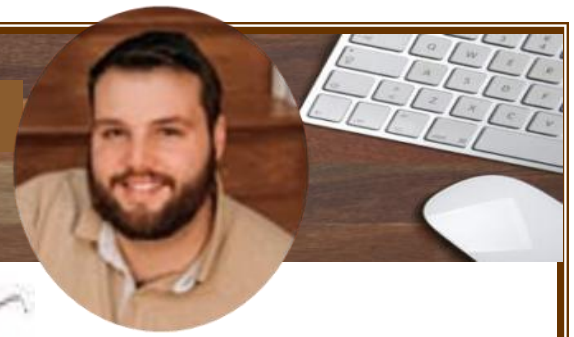
Pastor Appreciation Day is October 10th

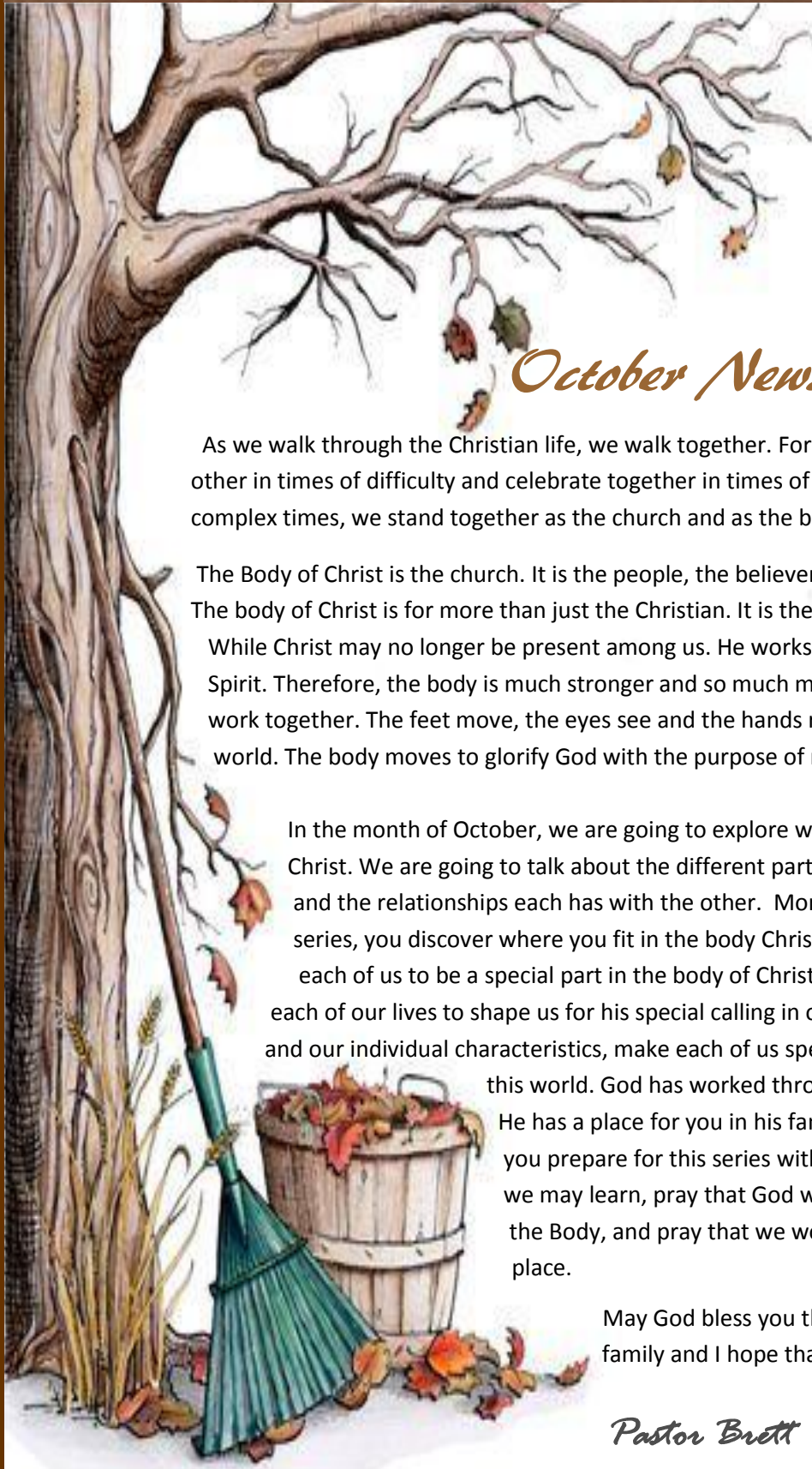
