
1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT *Hanging of the Greens*

FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH PROPOSED 2022 PROPOSED BUDGET


First Baptist Church Trustee Board, after much thought and prayerful consideration, recommends the 2022 Operating Budget for your review and approval.
