# Reflections from the Pastor by Pastor Brian Taylor



Dear Friends:

I recently watched the movie "Wonder Woman". It was an action movie that actually had a message to share. The movie began with the goal of Wonder Woman needing to kill the God of War, Ares. Ares wanted to kill mankind and Wonder Woman believed that killing Ares would put an end to war and evil. The Christian parallel would be to believe that if Satan was killed, evil on earth would end.

At the end of the movie, Wonder Woman and Ares face off. Ares argues that evil is not caused by him, but by mankind. If they joined forces and killed off mankind, that would eliminate evil in the world. He argued mankind deserved to be killed.

At that point, I thought of Noah and the flood. When God saw all the evil on the earth, God could have decided to end the "human experiment." Certainly, mankind deserved to die. But God decided to continue to love his sinful creation, and saved Noah and his family. Which by the way, did not stop evil on the earth.

Wonder Woman counters the argument of Ares by saying, it's not about what you deserve, it's about what you believe. As a "god", she believes in love. She believes in loving mankind, not giving them what they deserve.
