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From The Desk of Pastor Misael ...

In the seven weeks of Easter, we find the disciples to be in a time of transition between the Resurrection of Jesus and the Day of Pentecost. During the fifty days between these two major events, Jesus' disciples have some very unique experiences. This period is a holy time, marked by joy from their encounters with the Risen Christ, but also fraught with confusion as the disciples struggle to

understand the resurrection and come to terms with the fact that Jesus was ascending to the Father

In the midst of this time period, Jesus breathes on the disciples and gives them the Holy Spirit. This is just a taste of what is to come.

Transition time in the church setting is also a holy time, similarly characterized by joy and excitement, yet we can find ourselves confused and overwhelmed.

The disciples spent their post-resurrection time in self-study, revisiting Jesus' teachings while getting a glimpse of what was to come for them in their future ministry. This was a formative time for them, where the Holy Spirit helped them remember Jesus' teachings and how those lessons had changed and shaped their lives.

Our texts for Sunday Worship Service include passages from the book of Acts, which describe what God was doing as the church was expanding. These texts come at a very opportune time for Our Redeemer; we are examining ORC's vision and mission.

I pray that you will continue to be filled with the Holy Spirit to give you clarity, rekindle excitement and joy, and affirm your vision and mission for today and into the future.

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A Conversation with

Tony Caltagirone, a True Gentleman by Will Fleming

TONY CALTAGIRONE has been a member of Our Redeemer Church for more than 40 years. On June 10th, Tony will celebrate his 94th birthday. His story starts in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania in 1928, where he was born and resided, along with sister Josephine and his parents, until moving to Lowellville, Ohio in 1940.

Tony attended Ohio Northern University, and graduated with a degree in premedicine. He then attended Ohio State University and graduated with a degree in medical technology. Tony used the knowledge he gained from his formal education by holding several positions in hospital laboratories.

When Tony moved to California, he took a position with A.H. Robbins Pharmaceuticals. He continued his employment with that pharmaceutical company for over 30 years.

In 1965, Tony married Bernice, who was running her own private elementary school. Bernice shared her knowledge with Our Redeemer and assisted with the formation and establishment of our preschool.

Prior to his marriage to Bernice, Tony had been a Methodist. Bernice, who was a Lutheran, convinced Tony to join Our Redeemer. Tony does not regret his decision. Tony smiled as he said, "The best part of ORC is the congregation—everyone is nice and very enjoyable to be around. And the pastors have been wonderful."

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SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

ARE YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW PLANNING TO ATTEND COLLEGE IN THE FALL?? Our Redeemer has TWO memorial scholarships available to assist students:

Phil Lochhaas Memorial Scholarship

This \$500 scholarship honors Phil Lochhaas, who served as the Youth Director at ORC. Our Redeemer members who are pursuing a college education are eligible to apply; applicants need to show they will be enrolled in a degree-granting program this Fall. The scholarship can be re-applied for as long as the student is continuing his/her education. This is a non-competitive scholarship.

Pat Stearns Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship honors Pat Stearns, a registered nurse who regarded nursing as not just a profession, but a calling. The scholarship is open to everyone who is pursuing a career in an accredited nursing program. This scholarship is competitive, but ORC has been able to support more than one student in prior years.

Applications are available at the church office and June 6, 2022, is the <u>deadline</u> to apply.

Call Process Update

The Transition Committee met for the first time in November 2021 to begin the Our Redeemer call process. The committee members are Annette Agosta, Kameron Andersen, Edmund Channita, Will Fleming, Ron Stearns, and Carol Tuntland (chair). We have acquainted ourselves with the Ministry Site Profile, hosted a History Day on March 19, 2022, and a Core Values Day on April 23, 2022. Pastor Misael is our pastoral guidance counselor at Our Redeemer. We are also assisted through this process by Pastor Terry Tuvey Allen (Mobility and Congregational Transition) at the Pacifica Synod.

At the History Day, insights were shared by **Sharon Thompson** (who spoke about WELCA, choir, worship and music); **Gladys Bale** (whose topic was the early days at Our Redeemer); **Wendy Fitzharris** (who talked about growing up at Our Redeemer and VBS experiences); **Lori Martin** (who shared her experiences about growing up at Our Redeemer and her parents', Don and Sylvia Woodhouse's, activities at Our Redeemer); **Jim Huffman** (who discussed SHIP and the church campus/facilities); **Tom Kent** (who told stories about Our Redeemer's pastors and interns); **Jerry Engelhardt** (who provided insights about social ministries, including Compassion International, and Lynda's leadership role); and **Ann Badertscher** (who walked us through ORC's music program through the years, including Living Pictures).

Participants also their experiences at their lunch tables prior to the program. Stories from Lori Martin, Sharon Thompson, Jerry Engelhardt, Annette Agosta, Wendy Fitzharris, Ann Badertscher, and Tom Kent were published in the April Newsletter, which is still available at www.orcgg.org. Thanks to the speakers and all the participants for providing wonderful memories about the growth of Our Redeemer. (I encourage you to reread the April newsletter. If you can't access it online, call Julie at the church office to obtain a print copy.)

Our second event took place in Endter Hall on Saturday, April 23, where we explored Our Redeemer's core values. Currently, ORC's Mission Statement describes our purpose: "To spread the Good News to all through joyful worship and service, so that others may believe and accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Our Redeemer lives!"

The Pacifica Synod publishes a manual which directs the call process, <u>Embracing Transition</u>, subtitled, "Transition and Call Process Manual." Core values are defined therein: "Core Values are intended to communicate what the congregation stands for and on what principles it operates. They guide the everyday actions of members and staff as well as congregational planning."

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With this in mind, Kameron Andersen gave a PowerPoint presentation which defined 16 possible Core Values: Action, Collaboration, Community, Creativity, Education, Empowerment, Faith, Inclusion, Integrity, Kindness, Love, Mission, Music, Outreach, Welcome, and Worship. Each Core Value was explained and the definition appearing in the Merriman-Webster Dictionary was also incorporated.

The following speakers shared Core Values: **Dorothie Bair** (Love), **Joe Brozick** (Integrity), **Larry Collier** (Community), **Patty Erickson** (Education), **Dave Frostad** (Inclusion), **Larry Klevos** (Music), **Tina Ray** (Creativity), and **Patty Trevor** (Collaboration). You can access a video of the day's activities and hear all the speakers' presentations on the Our Redeemer website. *Soli Deo Gloria*—To God Alone be the Glory.

Participants in the Core Values Day completed two activities: They shared 10 words that they, individually, live by each day as Personal Values. After the speakers' presentations, participants were asked to share 10 values that Our Redeemer lives by. The results have been tallied and are posted with the video on ORC's website. Thanks to Patty Erickson for videoing the day.

What is next in the process? FIRST! We will listen—For God's voice in the midst of our transition from one pastor to our interim pastor—Pastor Misael—to our next pastor. We will research the demographics of our own congregation and the neighborhood surrounding Our Redeemer. We will also explore our vision of the future as a congregation. How do we do this? We talk with the congregation—we will have a meeting on **June 4th** to discuss what we have discovered through the first two events. We walk the neighborhood, talk with the schools and the businesses in the area, and visit churches in our community as we continue to explore ORC's purpose, giftedness, and mission. You—as the congregation—have a vital role in this entire process. We need everyone's input.

The Transition Committee is responsible for completing the MSP (Ministry Site Profile). The MSP is a form designed by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) which describes ORC's mission and search for a rostered minister. The MSP is used across the entire ELCA and provides congregations and church-related organizations (such as schools, social ministry organizations, healthcare institutions, and other agencies) a standard method to communicate their needs. The MSP is completed by leaders within the congregation or organization, under the guidance of the synod bishop or Call Process Administrator.

Thank you for your interest in the Call Process. We are grateful to those ORC members who participated in the events so far and encourage everyone to attend upcoming events. The members of the Transition Committee are interested in your thoughts, questions, and suggestions; we are available by telephone, email., or in-person.


