

He brought his cheerful demeanor to the homebound, visited members in the hospital, and stood by us as we grieved, remembered, and celebrated the lives of ORC members who passed away in 2022.

The Season of Lent

Each year, the Christian church embarks on a forty-day journey leading up to Easter, known as the season of Lent. For Lutherans, this season is important. But what is Lent? Why do we observe it?

The Scriptures do not specifically mention Lent, but it has a longstanding tradition in the Church closely derived from the contents of Scripture. As Christ prepared for Good Friday and the Resurrection, the Church follows the Lord into sin's death and resurrection life through the liturgical calendar. Lent recalls the time Christ spent overcoming temptation in the wilderness. Derived from the Anglo-Saxon word, "lencten" (meaning "lengthen" or the time of lengthening of the days), Lent is one of the six seasons of the Christian calendar.

There are many traditions and symbols which mark this season. For example, the color purple adorns the Lord's house throughout the days of Lent. The significance of purple dates back to ancient times, when dye to make purple was very difficult to source, thus purple was a color attributed to royalty. Jesus was draped with purple only once—when He was mocked and ridiculed as the "King of the Jews" prior to His crucifixion. This deep hue has come to represent solemnity, penitence, and prayer as God's people meditate on the agony His Son willingly endured.

Twice during the Lenten season—on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—the color black decorates the church to symbolize the absence of light, and the curse of sin and darkness which fell over all of creation. Only the death of God's perfect Son could abolish that darkness and provide atonement for sin.

On Ash Wednesday, the sign of the cross is applied upon a Christian's forehead during the imposition of ashes. Traditionally, the ash is created by burning palms from the previous Palm Sunday. This symbolic rite reminds us of the sign of the cross that was placed on us in our Baptisms, reminds us of our mortality ("[r]emember: you are dust, and to dust you shall return"), and the filth of our sin that the blood of Jesus has washed away.

Another traditional component of the Lenten season is the omission of the word "Alleluia" from the liturgy and hymnody, as well as an omission of the Hymn of Praise. "Alleluia," meaning "*Praise the Lord*" in Hebrew, returns full-voice in the glorious celebration of Easter morning.

The practice of fasting or giving something up during Lent is not required for Lutherans because it is not commanded in Holy Scripture. However, Lutherans may elect to abstain from a "pleasure of the flesh" to remember the great sacrifice of Jesus on the cross to pay for the world's sin.

There are two guiding principles for the observance of Lent: We *should grow in our* faith and love toward Jesus crucified, and we should exercise a penitent heart while always keeping an eye on the victory of God on Easter.

May your Lenten journey bless you as you experience the depth of Jesus' obedience and the great love of God to redeem a world so desperately in need of salvation.
