
#### Mission Corner...



Every four years Moravian young adults in North America have an opportunity to come together for a Moravian Young Adult Convocation. The next Young Adult Convo is this summer as participants will travel to the U.S. Virgin Islands, St. Thomas and St. John to see many of the historic Moravian sites and find inspiration and vision for current ministry. Together we will retrace the steps of the first Moravian Missionaries, David Nitschmann and Leonhard Dober from the gleaming crystal shores of St. Thomas harbor to lush greenery of Posauneberg (the Bretheren's Plantation) now the site of New Herrnhut Moravian Church, climb the famous 99 Steps of Charlotte Amalie for an incomparable view of the Caribbean and locate Nisky Moravian Church where

we will gather to worship and explore our Moravian Mission roots, meet Moravian pastor and author Winelle J. Kirton-Robert and together examine the Moravian beliefs that influenced the faith of formerly enslaved Africans, and spend two full days helping to rebuild Moravian Churches and schools damaged by Hurricane Irma.
