THE SEVEN AGREEMENTS SERIES HAS BEEN COMPILED INTO A BOOKLET

This past spring, a series of articles by Vince Holbrook entitled *The Seven Agreements* ran in the newsletter. These articles explored how the Southern Province has structured the decision-making process around seven important issues (listed below)—each of which has been controversial at one time or another.

In addition to the seven issues, the series included an introduction and a piece explaining the Church Board's intention to survey the congregation. The survey will seek input on the use of our church facilities and the preferred personal characteristics of future pastors. The Church Board felt it was important to share information with the congregation about the issues, especially the two issues where the Board still has leeway in making their decisions, before asking the congregation for their opinion on these matters.

The articles have now been compiled into a booklet and were emailed to the congregation on June 20. Printed copies of the booklet will also be available in the narthex. If you did not receive the booklet by email and would like one, please contact the church office.

The seven issues are:

- Agreement 1: Who chooses a congregation's pastor?
- Agreement 2: Who qualifies pastors?
- Agreement 3: Who may be married by a Moravian pastor?
- Agreement 4: Who decides how a church uses its facilities?
- Agreement 5: Who is responsible for employing church staff?
- Agreement 6: Who may become a member of our congregation?
- Agreement 7: Who may take communion?

The current Board of First Moravian Church, Greensboro, would like to hear the thoughts and insights of all communicant members age 18 and older regarding two matters that remain at the discretion of our congregation, particularly as they relate to sexual identity and orientation:

- Use of church grounds and facilities for events such as weddings
- Criteria for pastoral calls

While individual members have shared their opinions informally, we are not aware of any previous proactive effort to gather input from all communicant members. We would greatly appreciate your voluntary and completely anonymous responses to help guide our discernment.

We have created a brief, eight-question survey that should take about three minutes to complete, and which was sent out via email to all eligible congregants. The most efficient way to participate is by completing the survey online; however, if you would prefer a paper copy, please reach out to the church office.

Non-communicant members and communicant members under the age of 18 are not eligible to take the survey. However, they are welcome to share their thoughts by submitting a letter to the Church Board—anonymously if they wish.

To be clear:

- We are not expecting to initiate a pastoral call process, nor do we have any current request to use our facilities that requires policy reconsideration.
- This is not a vote or a ballot. The Board, guided by the Holy Spirit, is entrusted with making or revising policy as needed, and is not required to conduct a survey or hold a congregational vote.
- That said, the Board believes that your input—prayerfully offered and collected in a respectful, anonymous, and objective way—can play an important role in the Board's informed discernment.

We hope you will take this opportunity to share your thoughts and help shape the future direction of our ministry. If you have any questions, please contact the church office. Thank you for your participation.

POSTCARD FROM THE CARIBBEAN: SISTER LUCILLE REFLECTS ON THE 14TH MORAVIAN WOMEN'S CONFERENCE

The 14th Moravian Women's Conference of June 22-28, 2025, was held aboard RCCL's *Oasis of the Seas*. I was able to fellowship and worship with sisters from 123 Moravian congregations. It was an unforgettable experience. Our theme, "Fashioned Focused Faithful," was taken from Psalm 119:73. Our theme hymn was "I, the Lord of Sea and Sky."

- Monday: Our first stop was A Perfect Day at Coco Cay, Bahamas in place of Labadee Island, Haiti. We had a tasty barbeque, different fruit juices, and ice cream. Many cooled off in the lagoons, some did water slides or zipline. A perfect day it was.
- ❖ Tuesday: Our featured speaker, Dr. Anique Elmes-Matthew, began her presentation, but the Holy Spirit had other ideas, turning her presentation into a powerful Holy Spirit healing service. Later that afternoon, we had Holy Communion. At 6pm there was a cocktail reception with everyone dressed up. One of two formal nights. Very nice.
- Wednesday: We were transported by busses from the port to the New Irwin Moravian Church, Falmouth, Jamaica to an island-themed Lovefeast of ginger beer, lemonade, and rock cakes (like a scone). We were welcomed by the New Generations Cultural Band. They were good. We received our program along with a sterile alcohol pad to clean our hands in anticipation of sharing our cake. The food and cultural experience in "the village" was a beautiful memory.
- Thursday: Dr. Elmes-Matthew continued her presentation highlighting women of the Bible, namely Eve, Tamar, Hannah, Esther, and the Samaritan woman. As we know, God uses anyone to fulfill His purpose. Our closing service was held later followed by a Cultural Affair where attendees were dressed in their cultural outfits and briefly described their islands. Attendees were recognized for being the youngest and oldest (91 years old), birthdays, number of conferences attended, first time cruisers, and drawing for a quilt.
- Friday: We arrived in Nassau, Bahamas along with three other cruise ships. There were a lot of us there.
- **Saturday**: We departed from Fort Lauderdale with lifelong memories, and new vigor to be focused and faithful to our Creator and His creation.
