2026 SOUTHERN PROVINCE SYNOD

Jane McKinney and I joined nearly 170 voting delegates, along with observers and representatives from across the Moravian Unity, at the 2026 Southern Province Synod held at New Philadelphia Moravian Church. The theme, "Ever Transforming, Ever Renewing," was based on Romans 12:2.

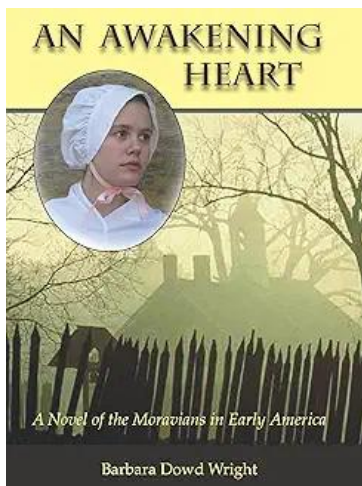
A historic highlight was the election of Andi Williams, currently employed at the Center for Creative Leadership in Greensboro, as PEC president, making her the first layperson and first woman to serve in that role. (See other members above.) Synod also elected three new bishops of the Unity (see picture at left).

Of the nearly 40 proposals considered by committees, 29 made it to the floor of Synod. Of those, 28 were approved and one was tabled. Among the actions adopted were guaranteeing each congregation at least two delegates at Synod, creation of a Faith Formation Digital Resource Hub, providing training for church boards and youth leaders, arranging for youth gatherings, offering translation services, expanding the relationship with Churches for Middle East Peace, and supporting the "humane and just treatment of individuals and families seeking refuge and asylum in the United States."

Synod also approved renaming the Florida-Georgia District the Southern Shores District, recognizing the growth of Moravian ministries in that region. Since the 2022 Synod, the District has grown from six congregations and three fellowships to seven congregations and five fellowships, including the chartering of Margate Moravian Church, the recognition of the Sarasota Fellowship, the launch of the Jacksonville Fellowship, the Savannah Fellowship in Georgia, and the welcoming of the Jan Hus Moravian Church in Port Arthur, Texas.

WHAT'S GOING ON IN IN FIRST MORAVIAN'S COMMUNITY GARDEN?

Despite the bone-dry weather, our garden has begun producing. In the past week or two, we have delivered four kitchen-trashcan-sized bags of kale to Greensboro Urban Ministry. We planted three varieties of kale -- red Russian, dinosaur, and winterbor kale -- and all are growing well in the lower part of the garden. We are also keeping a close eye on our squash and zucchini plants, which are beginning to ripen. Our Blue Lake bush beans are growing nicely and, if they follow the pattern set by crops in previous years, should produce well throughout the summer. We also have tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, cucumbers, okra, and radishes. And at the top of the garden are our herb beds. You will see some of the herb harvest in the dried spices, oils, etc., that Vince and Susan Holbrook dehydrate, process, and sell at Candle Tea.

Do you have time to help in the garden? We welcome volunteers from the congregation. The newest gardeners to join our roster are Mariel Rose and Allison Martin. You don't have to know lots about growing to be a valuable helper. We need people who can water sections of the garden during this dry spell, pull a few weeds, pick ripe produce, and/or make deliveries to Urban Ministry several days each week. PRAY EVERY DAY: JUNE 2026

1. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. Pray for the Moravian Church Southern Province as the delegates prepare for Synod.
2. In God, whose word I praise, in the Lord, whose word I praise. Pray for the new bishop of the Moravian Church in Zambia.
3. So the law was put in charge to lead us to Christ that we might be justified by faith. Pray for PEC members, bishops, and other church leaders, especially for those at the Southern Province Synod beginning today.
4. Then the Lord your God will make you most prosperous in all the work of your hands. Pray for the resolutions at the Southern Provincial Synod to make us prosperous for works of God.
5. Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord! Pray for the committee work at the Southern Province Synod occurring today.
6. Of this man's posterity God has brought to Israel a Savior, Jesus, as he promised. Pray for unity as a new President of the PEC is elected and the Southern Province Synod closes today.
7. Jesus said, "In the world you face persecution, but take courage: I have conquered the world!" Pray for Christians in the warring regions of the Middle East, Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Lebanon/Gaza, Ukraine, and Russia.
8. Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." Pray for our church leaders in our country to put their nets again and again. Remember the story of the Pear Tree in the beginnings of the Moravian Church in South Africa.
9. But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions, it is by grace you have been saved. Pray for short term mission teams.
10. For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Pray for Moravians in Sierra Leone.
11. Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. Pray for seminarians and candidates for ordination.
12. I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. Pray for the Moravians in Peru and Brazil.
13. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Pray for the Clinica Evangelica Morava in Ahaus.
14. I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave himself for me. Pray for Moravians in Cuba.
15. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. Pray for Moravians in Honduras, Nicaragua, and Costa Rica.
16. Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. Pray for the Ray of Hope school in Kenya, near Shimba Hills.
17. Wake up, O sleeper, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you. Pray for the Teshes in Kenya as they continue ministries outside of Ray of Hope school.
18. Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not men. Pray for Phil and Eunice Raiford in Mexico.
19. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Pray for the Rajpur Foster Child Project.
20. I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. Pray for the Moravian women clergy in Tanzania.
21. Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. Pray for the Moravian pastors who are undergoing major health challenges.
22. May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as ours does for you. Pray for the HIV/AIDS ministry in Tanzania, which the Hoffmans started.
23. Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. Pray for Steve and Ann Marx with Mission Aviation Fellowship.
24. May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. Pray for Michael and Brenda Brent serving in Croatia.
25. But we ought always to thank God for you, those loved by the Lord, because from the beginning God chose you to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth. Pray for the Moravian mission area in Brazil.
26. Finally, pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was with you. Pray for the Moravian congregations in Alaska as they continue to recover from the devastating typhoon.
27. I want people everywhere to lift up holy hands in prayer, without anger or disputing. Pray for Moravians in Labrador.
28. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. Pray for Morongo Moravian Church in California.
29. Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. Pray for the Board of World Mission.
30. For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayer. Pray for Estamos Unidos Moravian Ministry.
