My wife Sally is a registered nurse who is a graduate of Baylor University (B.S.N.). She worked in a variety of hospitals and public schools. Sally retired as the school nurse for Plainview High School in 2006. Sally and I are blessed with two daughters. Marnie works for the Wagner Oil Company in Fort Worth, and Meredith is a social worker who until recently lived in Austin. We live in Plainview, having returned there from Colorado March 2010.

I am looking forward to serving the Lord with you here in Idalou. Once again, I look forward to getting to know you better. It is both a joy and a privilege to be with you.


