

## NEWS FROM THE ROCK...



## November 2023

November is a great month to go on a Gratitude Journey. This is a time where we focus on the people/stuff/places that we are grateful for such as McDonalds Diet Coke, RUMC, Zach, fall leaves, etc. Included in the newsletter is a calendar with daily prompts for what to be grateful for and I encourage you to think about the prompt every day. My prayer is that this journey will give you an opportunity to see all the good things in the world that God has provided.



I am including the letter, (below) that I wrote for 2023 Charge Conference. I am so very proud of y'all. I am so grateful to be your pastor. The Holy Spirit is moving and shaking and y'all are creating such a beautiful dance.

"I remember last August I felt so overwhelmed by everything that was happening; Fall Festival, Pet Blessing, Halloween Festivities, Confirmation, Nominations and Charge Conference, Advent, and Christmas Pageant just to name a few. I remember that I took a huge piece of paper and under every month, I wrote the date and event. I hung that sheet of paper on the back of my office door, and I would look at it every morning. I even ordered a large 2023 yearly calendar. I hung it up in December and I marked everything for the year.


Even with everything marked, there were still weddings and funerals. We had a Membership Sunday that welcomed 12 folks into the church. We baptized two babies, two children, and one teenager. We confirmed six youth on Confirmation Sunday. We welcomed three Micah Corp Interns for the summer. Church life is exciting, exhausting, and excoriating.

As I walked into the church in July of 2022, I found a church that was in hibernation. As the months moved on, slowly the congregation woke up to see what was happening. As we built relationships and joined in ministry, the hibernation was over and RUMC was hungry. We worked on the budget. We worked on transparency. We worked on being healthy.

This summer, I received a magazine, TCN Professional Journal, and there was an article titled, "Just What is a Healthy Church Anyway?" I don't read word for word near as much as I should, which could be attributed to being in school for a long time. But this article made me stop and read word for word because it was good. The author believes that a healthy church "is a community of Jesus followers with shared vision, thriving ministry, and trusted leadership" (8). I try to remind you every week to be the hands and feet of Jesus because I believe that the church's job is to be Jesus in the world. A healthy church also has a shared vision which, according to Wilson, "invites us joyfully to align all our resources- spiritual, mental/emotional, physical, financial and structural- toward shared Kingdom work" (9). It seems that RUMC has been in a scarcity mindset for a season, and we need to focus on who we are. We are a project-oriented church. We show up and show out when we are charged to collect/fundraise for a project. Let's capitalize on this because a healthy church has thriving ministry. We are getting there. Our congregation is growing, our finances are growing, and our commitment needs to continue to grow and our passion for ministry needs to flourish. What can we do for the community? How can we embody Christ in the world. Last, a healthy church is one where there is trusted leadership. This trusted leadership does not fall solely on me, your pastor. Trusted leadership is with clergy and laity. Nominations has worked hard to put the right people on the right committees using the gifts, time, and talent that our members have. I pray that we trust each other. We cannot continue to be on a journey of church health if there is no trust. Wilson says that the church must have "clear communication and encouraging words and actions by leaders embolden the congregation to step out in faith" (9). I believe we have a way to go; however, I know that your desire is to be a healthy church and to have a presence in the community.

As we continue to head toward 2024, I am praying you will contemplate these questions; do you desire RUMC to be a healthy congregation? Is your presence offering encouraging words and actions? Being healthy is a choice. We must choose wisely in order to do the work of Jesus Christ."
