My favorite thing about Connect is...

Connect helped me improve my course by...

“preparing students for in-class interactive activities.”

My top 3 tips for using Connect:

- “Give the Connect assignments substantial weight as part of the course grade.”
- “Create an absence policy or non-completion policy for the Connect activities such as You can only miss two Connect assignments throughout the semester and after your final course grade will suffer as you will receive an additional X% reduction.”
- “Familiarize yourself with the assignments in Connect just as you would with any other activity you would assign.”

My best advice for a new user:

“Model your Connect assignments after the scope and sequence of your textbook and title your Connect folders to match. For example, if you have “Vocabulary and Grammar” in the same textbook chapter, separate those out in your Connect design and have folders for, let’s say, “Chapter 1: Vocabulary” and “Chapter 1: Grammar.” The purpose of setting it up this way is that in any given semester your Connect course will match your course syllabus.”

What Connect could mean for you:

“Holding your students accountable for using Connect is a key component of using the digital platform and by having students complete the Connect activities prior to class, you guarantee that they will arrive to class prepared.”
