Using Reports to Understand Course Data

In this tutorial, we'll explore how to use a combination of reports as well as the Insight tool for the most thorough understanding of course data.

A key component of our Learning Science approach is **how we use data to improve and enhance the learning experience.**

Data analysis shows us what's effective—and what isn't. We've explored the specific purpose of each of the six Connect reports, but in order to gauge the effectiveness of your course assessments, you'll want to cross-reference multiple reports.
