Closed Captioning your VODs

With the Closed Captioning feature enabled your VODs will automatically be Closed Captioned after upload. For other scenarios follow the guides below.

Auto Caption previously uploaded VODs

1. From the Links page, select **VODs** under the **My Library** heading.
2. Select your video from the VOD Listing by clicking its name or  **Edit**.
3. Under the **Additional Settings** heading select **Automate Closed Captioning**.
4. Click the **Generate Captions** button.


Attach your own Closed Captions File

1. From the Links page, select **VODs** under the **My Library** heading.
2. Select your video from the VOD Listing by clicking its name or  **Edit**.
3. Under the **Additional Settings** heading select **Closed Captioning Files**.
4. Under the **Options** heading select **Add New File**.
5. Fill out the given fields.
 - a. **Language/Label**: Language of the caption file.
 - b. **Description**: A description of the caption file.
 - c. **Deactivate**: Check if you do not want to use the caption file.
 - d. **Creation Type**:
 - i. If you have a caption file you wish to attach to your video, select **File Upload** then select your file using the **Browse...** button.
 - ii. If you want to create a caption file from scratch, select **Build Custom**.

6. Click **Save**.
7. If you uploaded a file you are done. If you selected to build a custom file you will be taken to the Closed Caption Editor and need to follow the next steps.
8. Create captions by selecting **+Add New**. Set the start time, end time, and caption content, then click **Add Caption**.
9. When you are done adding captions click **Save File**.

Edit a Closed Captions File

1. From the Links page, select **VODs** under the **My Library** heading.
2. Select your video from the VOD Listing by clicking its name or  **Edit**.
3. Under the **Additional Settings** heading select **Closed Captioning Files**.
4. Select **Captions Editor** for the Closed Caption File you wish to edit
5. Select a caption to load it into the editor.
6. From there you can edit the start time, end time, and/or the caption itself then click **Update Caption**.
7. You can delete a caption by selecting it then clicking **Remove**.
8. You can add a new caption by selecting **+Add New** at the top of the captions table. Fill out its information, then click **Add Caption**.
9. When you are done editing your captions click **Save File**.
