2022 Larkmead Solari

Our sole A+ wine rating this year — and the only A+ Rob has ever awarded anything — came from Napa's Larkmead, which is no stranger to our top 10 lists. A giant of a wine, it's an iconic example of California's best, concentrated cassis supported by black tea, anise, and dark chocolate that manages to cut through the dense, black fruit with a razor's edge.
