CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS Effective January 1, 2024

PART 1: CONSTITUTION

100 Name

100.1 The name of this organization will be the “Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association”, abbreviated EIVA.

101 Mission Statement

101.1 To protect, finance, market, and maximize the Competitive Integrity of our automatic bid to the NCAA MVB Collegiate Championship

- A. Protect—ensure total compliance with the NCAA regulations and requirements both as a conference and as individual programs to keep the automatic bid.
- B. Finance—provide appropriate financial support to hold a first-class EIVA Championship and supply individual programs with state-of-the-art supplies and educational opportunities.
- C. Market—sells our product to the east and the nation. Increase our visibility as an entertaining league with competitive teams and exciting players.
- D. Maximize—improve the quality of our individual programs to strive towards having our EIVA representative win the NCAA Men’s Volleyball Collegiate Championship.

Competitive Integrity—The totality of all the principles, actions, responsibilities, and ideals needed to maintain possession of our automatic bid with the utmost regard to the NCAA

102 Association Code

102.1 Constitution and Bylaws - The EIVA will be governed by a code consisting of two parts; namely, the Constitution and the Bylaws. The Bylaws consist of Administration and Operating Procedures, Operating Rules, and League Operation Procedures. To the extent that the Bylaws may conflict with the Constitution, statutes of the Constitution will prevail.

103 Membership

103.1 Membership will be limited to four (4) year colleges and universities who are NCAA members and sponsor men’s varsity DI or DII volleyball.

103.2 Members must adhere to the constitution of the EIVA.

- 103.3 Election to membership - Interested prospective members can acquire all membership information from the office of the Executive Director (a.k.a. EIVA Commissioner) of the EIVA.
- 103.3.1 An institution wishing to become a member will make application to the Executive Director of the EIVA by **submission of new member questionnaire to include** letters from its President and Director of Athletics. The **questionnaire** must be accompanied by a check in the amount of \$10,000 plus the current annual dues (currently **\$5,000**/year). Checks will be refunded if membership is denied.
- 103.3.2 Membership applications must be submitted in full prior to the EIVA annual meeting held in May.
- 103.3.3 Acceptance as an association member is accomplished by a three-fourths vote (currently **5**) of those members in attendance at the EIVA annual meeting.
- 103.4 Renewal of membership
- 103.4.1 Each Fall, the EIVA Treasurer will issue the yearly membership dues bill to each member institution's athletic director or officer-in-charge of men's volleyball and its Coach.
- 103.4.2 By paying the membership dues, an institution attests to be in compliance with all EIVA and NCAA rules, including adherence to the same player eligibility standards that are used by all varsity intercollegiate athletics at that institution; and certifies its commitment to participate, host, and travel as required to completion of the current NCAA MVB season.
- 103.5 Resignation of membership
- 103.5.1 A member may resign from the EIVA by written notice delivered to the Executive Director before the annual meeting **two years preceding the anticipated final season in the EIVA.**
- 103.5.2 **Institutions exiting the EIVA in good standing with a minimum of five (5) years of competition, will incur an exit fee of \$20,000. Institutions exiting the EIVA not in good standing or less than five (5) years of competition will incur a fee of \$40,000.**
- 103.6 Expulsion or suspension of membership
- 103.6.1 Any member that fails to meet the conditions and obligations of membership may be terminated, suspended, or otherwise disciplined by a three-fourths (currently **5**) affirmative vote of the membership. Grounds for disciplinary action will include, without limitation, failure to pay dues, failure to comply with EIVA scheduling requirements, any action or inaction which constitutes a violation of the Constitution or Bylaws or any other rule or regulation, and any action or inaction which

reflects poorly upon the reputation and integrity of the Association.

104 Organization

104.1 The establishment and direction of the EIVA between the EIVA annual meetings is committed to the Executive Director.

104.2 Executive Director (a.k.a. EIVA Commissioner)

104.2.1 The Executive Director will be chosen and employed on a part-time basis to aid in leading day-to-day operations of the EIVA in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, Bylaws, and other legislation of the EIVA. The Executive Director will make reports, conduct meetings, supervise officiating programs, gather and keep statistics and other data, and otherwise administer and manage the affairs of the EIVA.

104.2.2 The Executive Director will have the following responsibilities:

1. Implement EIVA policy as approved by the membership and Executive Committee;
2. Meet with, as necessary, with constituent coaches groups to address issues and concerns relative to their teams and the EIVA;
3. Enter into contracts and legal documents affecting routine and day-to-day operations and duties of the EIVA;
4. Act responsibly in the capacity necessary to further the business of the EIVA in accordance with the provisions, principles, and the spirit of the Constitution;
5. Perform other duties as directed by the Executive Committee.

104.2.3 Candidates for Executive Director will come from the Executive Committee and will take office upon receiving three-fourths approval of the general membership.

104.3 Executive Committee

104.3.1 Officers will be selected by majority vote of the membership at the annual meeting. Tenure in office will continue until the election of new officers at the next annual meeting.

104.3.2 The officers will be; President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Administrative Representative.

104.3.3 The Executive Committee may appoint representatives from member institutions to assist them in any functions and they are not prohibited by association rules from delegating.

104.4 In time periods in which the office of Executive Director is vacant, the Executive Committee as a whole will act as Executive Director of the EIVA.

- 105 League organization**
- 105.1 For 2023-2024 the EIVA will consist of 8 members.
- 105.1.1 For the 2024 season, the membership will consist of: George Mason University, Pennsylvania State University, Princeton University, Harvard University, New Jersey Institute of Technology, and the University of Charleston.
- 105.3.1 Discussing a member requires three-fourths votes (currently 5) of the existing membership.
- 106 EIVA relation to the National Collegiate Athletic Association**
- 106.1 The Eastern representative from the NCAA Men's Volleyball Committee will maintain communication with the EIVA Executive Director.
- 106.2 The EIVA Tournament Champion will be the EIVA's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Men's National Volleyball Championship.
- 107 Adoption and amendments**
- 107.1 Changes in the rules governing the EIVA may be made by a three-fourths vote (currently 5) of the membership.
- 108 Effective date**
- 108.1 This constitution and these bylaws will become effective on the 1st day of January, 2024.

PART 2: ADMINISTRATIVE AND OPERATING PROCEDURES

- 200 Enumeration, selection, tenure, and powers and duties, of officers**
- 200.1 Selection and tenure of appointments
- 200.1.1 Officers will be selected by majority vote of the membership at the annual meeting. Tenure in office will continue until the election of new officers at the next annual meeting.
- 200.1.2 The officers will be; President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Administrative Representative.
- 200.1.3 The Executive Committee may appoint representatives from member institutions to assist them in any functions and they are not prohibited by association rules from delegating.
- 200.2 President - The President of the EIVA will preside at the meetings of the general membership and Executive Committee, call special meetings, vote as a member of the Executive Committee, and exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be delegated to him/her by the Executive Committee.
- 200.3 Vice President - The Vice President of the EIVA will vote as a member of the Executive Committee and exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be delegated to him/her by the

Executive Committee. The Vice President will also preside at meetings of the general membership and Executive Committee in the absence of the president. The Vice President shall act as the coaches' liaison to the Executive Committee.

- 200.4 Secretary - The Secretary of the EIVA will maintain minutes and documentation of EIVA proceedings and legislation, vote as a member of the Executive Committee, and exercise powers and perform such functions as may be delegated to him/her by the Executive Committee.
- 200.5 Treasurer - The Treasurer of the EIVA will manage the finances and keep financial records of the EIVA, vote as a member of the Executive Committee, and exercise powers and perform such functions as may be delegated to him/her by the Executive Committee.
- 200.6 **Administrative Representative** - The Administrative Representative of the EIVA shall be filled by the EIVA's representative to the NCAA committee, will vote as a member of the Executive Committee and exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be delegated to him/her by the Executive Committee. The Administrative Representative will also preside at meetings of the general membership and Executive Committee in the absence of the President and Vice President.
- 200.7 In the event of a vacancy (by resignation or otherwise) of the office of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Administrative Representative, replacement will be made as follows:
- 200.7.1 President: The Vice President will fill the office until the next annual meeting, at which time the position will be filled as dictated by 200.1.1.
- 200.7.2 Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Administrative Representative: The Executive Committee will elect a replacement who will fill the office until the next annual meeting, at which time the position will be filled as dictated by 200.1.1.
- 200.8 At Large Member(s) - the EIVA can choose to have "at-large" member(s) on the Executive Committee.

201 Meetings

- 201.1 Meeting of the membership (league meeting)
- 201.1.1 A meeting of the membership will be held at least once annually. The annual meeting will be held in the month of May after the conclusion of the NCAA MVB Championship.
- 201.1.2 Each member institution will appoint one (1) representative to the EIVA annual meeting. Regardless of the number of persons attending meetings of the EIVA, only a member's representative may vote.

- 201.1.3 Universities or colleges desiring EIVA membership will appoint a representative to attend the annual meeting. Upon acceptance of the association, representatives of the new member are allowed to vote in the same manner as other members.
- 201.1.4 Representation at the annual EIVA meeting is mandatory for college and universities with membership in the EIVA.
 - 201.1.4.1 Should a member not be represented for two (2) consecutive yearly meetings, such member will be ineligible to participate in the next year's EIVA Post Season competition.
- 201.1.5 The agenda of the annual meeting will include
 - 201.1.5.1 Approval of last year's meeting minutes
 - 201.1.5.2 Ad hoc reports
 - 201.1.5.3 Treasurer's report regarding the financial status of the EIVA
 - 201.1.5.4 Vice President's report
 - 201.1.5.5 President's report
 - 201.1.5.6 EIVA representative to the NCAA selection committee's report
 - 201.1.5.7 Membership downloads, changing status, discussing present members, adding new members
 - 201.1.5.7.1 Discussing a member requires three-fourths (currently 5) votes of the existing membership.
 - 201.1.5.8 Election of new officers
 - 201.1.5.9 Schedule end-of-season & playoff competition dates for the upcoming season.
 - 201.1.5.10 Changes in the rules governing the EIVA
 - 201.1.5.11 Any matter a member believes necessary for discussion by the EIVA
 - 201.1.5.11.1 Matters to be discussed at the annual meeting will be solicited from the Executive Committee, prepared by the Executive Director in consultation with the President, and submitted to the membership at least one week in advance of the meeting.
 - 201.1.5.11.2 Members of the EIVA will be able to submit agenda items anytime in advance of the meeting.
 - 201.1.5.11.2.1 The Executive Director of the EIVA will send out a notice(s) soliciting agenda items in a timely manner allowing for members of the EIVA to consider agenda items to submit.
 - 201.1.5.12 Announcement of next year's playing dates.
- 201.1.6 Proxy representation and votes are prohibited.

- 201.1.7 Meetings will be held in accordance with the general rules and usages of parliamentary procedures.
- 201.1.8 The annual EIVA meeting will serve, in part, as a scheduling meeting.
- 201.1.9 A minimum of three-fourths (currently 5) of the league membership, represented by a coach and/or administrator, will constitute a quorum for the purpose of amending and adopting items to the Constitution and/or Bylaws.
- 201.1.10 Minutes of the annual meeting will be recorded and permanently retained by the Secretary of the EIVA. The Secretary will distribute copies of the minutes to the Athletics Director (or officer-in-charge of men's volleyball) and coach of each member institution.
- 201.2 Special meetings may be held at the call of the Executive Director or upon the written request of three or more EIVA members. In any case, appropriate notice will be given. Whenever possible, these meetings will be by telephone conference call.
- 201.3 The Executive Committee will have regular meetings regarding league issues, as needed and appropriate, throughout the year. Except in unusual circumstances, these meetings will be by telephone conference call.

202 Finances

- 202.1 Each member is required to pay an annual membership fee, as listed below.
 - 202.1.1 For 2020-2021 the membership fee = \$3,910.00. (Dues = \$3,250 plus \$660 assignor fee)
 - 202.1.2 Membership fee amount increases voted at league meeting.
- 202.2 A checking account will be opened and maintained by the Treasurer and Executive Director of the Association. It will be called the "EIVA Account".
- 202.3 The money derived from the fees may be used for the following purposes:
 - 202.3.1 Running the Championship.
 - 202.3.2 Providing the www.EIVAvolleyball.com website.
 - 202.3.3 Remuneration of E.D., SID, & others workers (writers, photo).
 - 202.3.4 Mailing expenses/printing.
 - 202.3.5 Certificates, plaques, trophies.
 - 202.3.6 Other purposes authorized by the membership.

203 Dispute resolution and procedures for resolution of controversies between member institutions (includes all protests)

- 203.1 Disputes regarding the rules and regulations of volleyball must be resolved on the court. The referee's decisions are final. Also, there will be no protests of judgment calls.
- 203.2 For disputes of administration during a regular season match, the following procedure has been adopted:
1. The coach and event director should first attempt to reach resolution at the site;
 2. An athletic administrator may bring the dispute to the Executive Director, in writing, within three days following the match;
 3. The Executive Director will contact the Executive Committee for investigation. A majority vote by the Executive Committee is required for a decision;
 4. Decisions of the Executive Committee may be appealed to the Executive Director;
 5. If the timing of the appeal does not permit contact with the entire Executive Committee, the Executive Director is empowered to act immediately on the matter.
- 203.3 For disputes of administration during a championship event, a committee consisting of an independent (i.e., not involved in the Championship) member of the EIVA and all involved coaches will work together to resolve the issue.
- 203.4 For disputes unrelated to the rules and regulations of volleyball, including but not limited to recruitment, fan behavior, advertisement and promotion, the following procedure has been adopted:
- 203.4.1 Athletics Directors (or officers-in-charge of men's volleyball) of the involved institutions should first attempt to reach resolution.
- 203.4.2 Athletics Directors (or officers-in-charge of men's volleyball) of the involved institutions may bring the dispute to the EIVA for resolution by contacting any member of the EIVA Executive Committee. The Executive Committee member will then contact all other members of the Executive Committee. A majority vote of the Executive Committee is required for the complaint to be investigated. The result of the investigation will then be brought up amongst the Executive Committee members for resolution. Decisions of the Executive Committee may be appealed to the Executive Director.
- 203.5 If a member of the Executive Committee is involved in a dispute brought before the committee, it will not participate except in a manner similar to a non-committee member. If all members of the committee are involved in the dispute, the committee will not hear the matter. Upon unanimous agreement, the committee will appoint an impartial board of association members to resolve the dispute. If arrangements to appoint an impartial board cannot be

made, then the entire membership, except those involved, will resolve the matter.

204 Procedures for serious violations

204.1 Alleged violations of EIVA and/or NCAA rules, by member institutions will first be referred to the member institution's athletics director. If it is necessary to further investigate an issue, the matter will be referred to the member institution's primary Conference Office for processing, and then to the NCAA.

205 Sports Information

205.1 The EIVA will employ an individual to fill the role of EIVA Sports Information & Communications Director.

205.1.1 Weekly results should be emailed to a person selected at the annual meeting who will be in charge of compiling stats on a weekly and yearly basis.

205.1.2 Updated statistics for leaders in both individual and team statistics will be published every week.

205.2 Sports Information Directors from EIVA member schools should assist the EIVA Sports Information Director and cooperate in the promotion of men's volleyball.

205.2.1 For institutions with no standing Sports Information Director, the coach or some other representative of the institution should fulfill the duties and expectations of Association SIDs.

205.2.2 Teams may nominate athletes for the EIVA Player of the Week award. Only those people nominated may receive the award.

205.2.3 All statistics and player of the week nominations must be turned in by 9:00 PM on Sunday night.

205.2.3 General minimum standards for SIDs

205.2.3.1 Send rosters (number, name, class, position, hometown, high school, height) to opponents. Information should be typed.

205.2.3.2 Have up-to-date results and statistics on hand when opposing SIDs call.

205.3 A representative from the Sports Information Department of the host institution must be in attendance at EIVA Championship events.

205.4 Reports, as necessary, are to be filed with each institution's Athletics Director by the Executive Director outlining details of any missed statistical data calls, late or incomplete calls, etc., by any member institution's Sports Information Director.

206 Supervisor of Officials

206.1 All EIVA schools will use the services of the same Supervisor of Officials to schedule game officials.

207 Communications Director

207.1 The EIVA may employ a separate individual to fill the role of EIVA Communications Director.

208 Adoption and amendments of Administrative and Operating Procedures, Operating Rules, and League Operations

208.1 Administrative and Operating Procedures, Operating Rules, and League Operations will become effective upon adoption by the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the present voting membership.

208.2 Bylaws may be amended as provided in Section 107.1 of the Constitution.

208.3 A proposed amendment to the Bylaws may be initiated by any member of the EIVA. Amendments may be proposed at any time, but should be proposed and submitted prior to the preparation of the meeting agenda (as dictated in Section 201.1.5.11).

209 Executive Director's decision

209.1 Decisions by the Executive Committee are binding on the parties unless they are overruled by an appeal to the Executive Director. The decision of the Executive Director is binding on the parties. The reversal or modification of the Executive Director's decision must be endorsed by a majority of the Executive Committee, except that the appealing institution will not have a vote if represented on the Committee.

210 Items not covered in Constitution or Bylaws

210.1 The Executive Director is empowered to interpret items not covered in the Constitution or Bylaws, subject to appeal to the Executive Committee. These items will automatically be placed on the agenda of the next annual meeting and brought to vote by the general membership

PART 3: OPERATING RULES

300 Eligibility

300.1 Each player must be an amateur who adheres to the same eligibility rules required of all varsity intercollegiate athletes at the institution he represents and the NCAA.

300.2 Any student transfer from one institution to another within the EIVA is a mandatory one-year of ineligibility period, unless written waivers are received from the athletic departments of both institutions.

300.3 Any member found guilty of using an ineligible player will forfeit all matches in which that player played and will be placed on probation for the following season. During the probationary period, the offending institution must meet all deadlines (to include the stipulation that their eligibility list be submitted to the Executive Committee at least one week prior to the beginning of any new term or semester that occurs during the season), establish for it by the Executive Committee. If the offending school fails to meet its obligations, it will be immediately dropped from the EIVA or changed to Associate Member status at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

301 Aid to athletes

301.1 In order to make it possible for student-athletes to have adequate time to pursue their studies, participate in athletics, and enjoy a cross-section of student activities, member schools are permitted to give scholarships, grants-in-aid, and/or part-time employment as defined in NCAA Bylaws, Article 15 (Principles Governing Financial Aid).

302 Recruiting

302.1 Guidelines for recruiting practices will be taken from the NCAA Bylaws, Article 13.

303 Letters-of-intent

303.1 Guidelines regarding Letters of Intent will be taken from the NCAA Bylaws, Article 13, Section 15

304 Coaching Ethics

304.1 The EIVA supports the ethical conduct of coaches as outlined by the American Volleyball Coaches Association's "Coaches Code of Ethics and Conduct" and the United States Olympic Committee's "Coaching Code of Ethics."

304.1.1 The AVCA "Coaches Code of Ethics and Conduct" will be attached as Appendix A.

305 Acts of unsportsmanlike conduct and subsequent penalties

- 305.1 Definition of unsportsmanlike conduct - Acts of unsportsmanlike conduct will include, but not be limited to:
1. Striking or physically abusing an official, opposing coach, or player.
 2. Intentionally inciting participants or spectators to violent or abusive action.
 3. Using obscene gestures or profanity or unduly provocative language or action towards officials, opponents, or spectators.
 4. Being critical publicly of any match official, EIVA personnel, another university or its personnel.

Any person who, after an investigation by the EIVA, is found to have committed one of the listed acts or any other act of unsportsmanlike conduct, will be subject to appropriate penalty.

The penalties may include a private or public reprimand, ejection from the contest, and/or suspension for one or more contests.

- 305.1.1 Bench personnel, other than the Head Coach, are prohibited from leaving the confines of the bench area to engage in a fight that may or has broken out on the court of play. Persons violating this rule are subject to investigation and may be subject to disqualification from participating in the contest, banned from remaining in the playing area, or suspended for one or more contests.
- 305.1.2 Under no circumstance may a player, coach, or other team bench personnel proceed into any area where spectators are present to retaliate for, or to initiate, any verbal or physical abuse. Bench personnel may not throw objects into areas containing spectators. Persons violating this rule are subject to investigation and may be subject to disqualification from participating in the contest, banned from remaining in the playing area, or suspended for one or more contests.
- 305.2 The Head Coach is the primary agent for promoting and controlling sportsmanlike behavior on the part of his/her own team and for promoting a sportsmanlike atmosphere at the contest site. Head Coaches are permitted to leave the bench in an attempt to stop a fight.
- 305.3 Member institutions will promptly notify the Executive Director and the Athletic Directors of any institutions involved in any action taken against any individual as a result of unsportsmanlike conduct. If a member institution believes that an individual from another institution should be disciplined for unsportsmanlike conduct, it will notify the institution, identifying the name(s) and the details of the complaint. The recipient Athletic Director will investigate the matter and notify the former institution and the Executive Director of the results of the investigation, including actions taken to discipline the individuals or the reason(s) why no action was taken.

305.4 The decision of the Executive Director is binding on the parties.

PART 4: LEAGUE OPERATIONS

400 Conference play

400.1 Conference structure will be as defined in Section 105 (League Organization).

400.2 Each team is required to play each team within the conference as mandated by the EIVA scheduling protocol. Teams shall meet twice each season, once home and once away or alternating annually two home/two away based on travel distance.

400.2.1 Conference play will finish the Saturday before the EIVA First Round of playoffs.

400.2.2 Whenever necessary, member institutions that are great distances from each other may have matches scheduled at some other member institution.

400.2.3 If a team is scheduled to play conference and non-conference matches on the same day, the conference match will be played first.

400.3 If two or more teams are tied for a position within the conference, the tie will be broken by the first differentiating point of comparison of the following criteria:

1. Head-to-head match record;
2. Head-to-head sets record;
3. Head-to-head total points scored;
4. Sets win percentage in conference matches;
5. Coin toss by the EIVA Commissioner.

401 Contracts

401.1 All matches within the EIVA will have contracts.

402 League Championship

402.1 The EIVA Championship Tournament

402.1.1 The EIVA Championship Tournament will consist of the top six teams.

402.1.2 The seeding for the EIVA Championship Tournament will be as follows:

402.1.2.1 The number one (1) seed and host for the EIVA quarterfinals, semifinals and final will be the winner of the EIVA regular Season.

402.1.2.2 The second (2) through sixth (6) seed will be seeded in the order in which they finished the EIVA Regular Season.

402.1.3 The tournament structure is as follows:

402.1.3.1 The quarterfinal matches will be (hosted by #1 seed):

#4 vs. #5

#3 vs. #6

See appendix D for bracket.

- 402.1.3.2 The winner of the 4/5 match will play the #1 seed, the winner of the 3/6 match will play #2. The winners of the two (2) semifinal matches will play for the EIVA Championship.
- 402.1.4 The rounds of the championship will be played on the following dates at the following site:
 - 402.1.4.1 The quarterfinals will take place the Wednesday following the last day of the regular season matches. The winners of Wednesday's quarterfinals will play in Thursday's semifinals.
 - 402.1.4.1.1 The #1 seeded team will have the right of first refusal to serve as host institution for the EIVA tournament.
 - 402.1.4.1.2 The host institution will determine times for all tournament matches and will select when teams will play.
 - 402.1.4.2 The winners of Thursday's semifinals will play in a Saturday championship, with the time to be determined by the host institution.
- 402.1.5 For the Championship, the first and second referees in addition to the line judges must be USAV certified officials and will not be affiliated with any of the participating teams. Affiliated will be defined as being on the scheduled payroll of that university or being enrolled in classes there. USAV certified scorers will be used. The Executive Committee will assign lines judges for the quarterfinals, semifinals and final championship matches.
- 402.1.6 The host institution will assign a tournament director.
 - 402.1.6.1 The tournament director should be an administrator or some other official from the host institution, and not a participating member of the host team.
- 402.1.7 The cost of all playoff officials (including certified lines judges) will be paid for by the EIVA.
- 402.1.8 The host institution will be responsible for the following duties:
 - 402.1.8.1 Publicity—including tournament program
 - 402.1.8.2 Assign a tournament director and issue awards (to be provided by the EIVA).
 - 402.1.8.3 Assist participating schools with local hotel and restaurant information.
- 402.1.9 Competing teams should have both light and dark uniforms available. The home team, or higher seeded team, should

wear light uniforms and the opposing team should wear uniforms of contrasting color.

402.1.10 Practice times for non-hosting teams should be made available on the day preceding all playoff matches. The host institution is responsible for providing appropriate gym time and volleyballs for use during practice.

402.1.11 The champion of the EIVA will be the winner of the EIVA Championship Tournament and will be the EIVA representative to the NCAA National Collegiate Men's Volleyball Tournament.

402.3 Teams participating in either the EIVA Championship Tournament must be in compliance with all NCAA and EIVA rules to be eligible, and must have paid league dues to the Treasurer of the EIVA prior to competing in the event(s).

403 Awards (XV)

403.1 All-EIVA Team

403.1.1 The All-EIVA team will be made up of 20 total players with 9 + libero of the players being on the first team and 9 + libero players being on the second team.

403.1.2 Coaches must nominate their own players for the All-EIVA team by filling out the nomination form and submitting it to the selection committee at a time specified.

403.1.2.1 Statistical information for every match played during the year by the player must be provided.

403.1.2.2 If more than one player from a team is nominated then each player must be ranked, with one (1) being the first choice for All-EIVA.

403.1.2.3 A player will not be considered for All-EIVA selection if he has not been nominated.

403.1.3 The selection committee made up of all six (6) members will then select, by conference call, the first and second teams.

403.1.4 Results of the All-EIVA Selections will be made public right before the EIVA Championship.

403.1.5 Individuals named to the All-EIVA first or second team will receive a certificate from the EIVA recognizing their accomplishments.

403.2 Uvaldo Acosta Memorial Player of the Year Award

403.2.1 The EIVA will select a Player of the Year.

403.2.1.1 The EIVA Player of the Year Award will be called the "EIVA Uvaldo Acosta Memorial Player of the Year Award"

- 403.2.1.2 The selected player of the year will then be the EIVA's representative for national player of the year.
- 403.2.2 Candidates for the Player of the Year award will come from the pool of candidates for All-EIVA.
 - 403.2.2.1 Players must be nominated as described in Section 403.1.2 to be considered for the Player of the Year award.
- 403.2.3 The All-EIVA selection committee will select the Player of the Year award during their All-EIVA selection conference call.
- 403.2.4 The winner of the Uvaldo Acosta Memorial Player of the Year Award will be made public right before the EIVA Championship.
- 403.2.5 The individual named EIVA Player of the Year will receive a certificate from the EIVA recognizing his accomplishment.
- 403.3 Newcomer of the Year Award
 - 403.3.1 A Newcomer of the Year will be selected by the EIVA
 - 403.3.2 Candidates for the Newcomer of the Year award will come from the pool of candidates for All-EIVA.
 - 403.3.2.1 To be considered for Newcomer of the Year, a player must have just competed in his first year of intercollegiate varsity volleyball.
 - 403.3.2.2 Players must be nominated as described in Section 403.1.2 to be considered for the Player of the Year award.
 - 403.3.3 The All-EIVA selection committee will select the Newcomer of the Year award during their All-EIVA selection conference call.
 - 403.3.4 The winner of the Newcomer of the Year Award will be made public right before the EIVA Championship.
 - 403.3.5 The individual named EIVA Newcomer of the Year will receive a certificate from the EIVA recognizing his accomplishment.
- 403.4 EIVA Championship All-Tournament Team and MVP
 - 403.4.1 At the conclusion of the tournament a six-person All-Tournament team and one MVP will be selected.
 - 403.4.2 The host institution should arrange for an appropriate nomination and selection process for the award. It is recommended that one of the following processes be used.
 1. An all-tournament selection committee be named
 2. A system of (involved) coaches voting is implemented.

- 403.4.3 The All-Tournament team and MVP will be publicly announced at the awards ceremony following the Championship match.
- 403.4.4 The All-Tournament team should be made public to all EIVA members following the tournament.
- 403.5 All-EIVA Academic Team
 - 403.5.1 The EIVA All-Academic Team will be made up of those student-athletes who have maintained a 3.3 GPA. Student-athletes listed as freshmen are not eligible for this award.
 - 403.5.2 Coaches must nominate their own players for the EIVA All-Academic team by filling out the nomination form and submitting it to the selection committee at a time specified.
 - 403.5.2.1 A player will not be considered for the EIVA All-Academic Team if he has not been nominated.
 - 403.5.3 Any student-athlete who meets the requirements for the EIVA All-Academic Team will be named to it.
 - 403.5.4 Results of the EIVA All-Academic Team will be made public right before the EIVA Championship.
 - 403.5.5 Individuals named to the EIVA All-Academic Team will receive a certificate from the EIVA recognizing their accomplishments.
- 403.6 EIVA Players of the Week Awards
 - 403.6.1 EIVA Players of the Week (one Offensive and one Defensive) will be named weekly from the third week in January through the conclusion of the EIVA Championship Tournament.
 - 403.6.2 Sports Information Directors or coaches reporting weekly statistics to the EIVA Sports Information Director may nominate players from their teams.
 - 403.6.2.1 Only those players nominated may be eligible to receive the award.
 - 403.6.3 The EIVA Sports Information Director will select the EIVA Players of the Week from the nominations submitted.
 - 403.6.3.1 If, at the discretion of the EIVA Sports Information Director, there are no suitable candidates for the award for the week or due to lack of nominations, no Player(s) of the Week will be named.
 - 403.6.4 Players recognized as EIVA Players of the Week will be announced on the weekly EIVA Update produced by the EIVA Sports Information Director.
- 403.7 EIVA Bob Sweeny Coach of the Year Award
 - 403.7.1 An EIVA Coach of the Year will be named.
 - 403.7.2 Recipient of the award will be selected during the All EIVA call.
 - 403.7.3 Award winners will be selected by the All-EIVA Selection Committee

- 403.7.4 The winner of the award will be notified immediately after selection/recognition.
- 403.7.5 The individual named Coach of the Year will receive a certificate from the EIVA recognizing his accomplishments.
- 403.8 Team awards
 - 403.8.1 The winner of the EIVA Championship Tournament will be presented with the championship trophy (Odeneal Cup) and Molten Plaque at the awards ceremony following the championship match.
 - 403.8.2 The runner-up of the EIVA Championship Tournament will be presented with the runner-up trophy and Molten Finalist plaque at the awards ceremony following the championship match.

404 Officials and lines judges

- 404.1 Only certified national or regional USA Volleyball (USAV) or Canadian Volleyball Association (CVA) referees will be used at all EIVA matches. The home team on the schedule has the responsibility of paying for officials. No person affiliated with any EIVA member team will be permitted to referee any sanctioned EIVA match. This includes divisional and interdivisional play, tournaments, and league playoffs. The sole exception will be by mutual agreement of the involved coaches prior to the match.
 - 404.1.1 Referees must wear the attire approved by USA Volleyball or the Canadian Volleyball Association.
 - 404.1.2 Affiliated will be defined as being on the scheduled payroll of that university or being enrolled in classes there.
- 404.2 Failure to provide such official score keeper may result in forfeiture by the host team provided one or more of the visiting teams submits a written protest to the EIVA Commissioner within one (1) week of the match in question and provided that the Executive Committee rules in favor of the protesting team(s).
- 404.3 Prior to the start of the season or as soon as possible, opponents must be provided with the names of officials that will be used during the match.
- 404.4 Conduct of officials deserving mention should be brought to the attention of the EIVA Commissioner.
- 404.5 Lines judges
 - 404.5.1 Line judges for EIVA division matches must be USAV, PAVO or State High School Association certified EIVA line judges.
 - 404.5.2 The EIVA Supervisor of Officials will assign line judges or all EIVA member hosted matches.
 - 405.5.3 Line judges for EIVA conference matches will be paid for by the member institutions.

- 404.5.4 Lines judges must wear a white shirt and dark pants.
- 404.6 There should be a cooperative relationship between coaches and officials, with frequent interchange of ideas and suggestions. Coaches should, whenever possible, accept invitations to attend officials' rules meetings. Similarly, coaches should extend officials invitations to discuss rules interpretations with their squads, and on occasion, to officiate at scrimmages for mutual benefits.
- 404.7 Officials should be treated in a courteous manner by coaches, bench personnel, and players.
- 404.8 Institutional personnel are prohibited from oral and written comments on officiating matters of any nature other than to EIVA officers. Such comments may not appear in institutional news releases or other institutionally published materials such as a coach's newsletter or event program. Institutional personnel may not publicly comment derogatorily on officiating to the public or media during contests, post-match interviews, or under other conditions when their comments could become public.
- 404.8.1 Any coach who is, after investigation, found guilty of violating the code of conduct in Section 404.7 will face appropriate punishment as determined by the EIVA Commissioner. Penalties for violation may include, but are not limited to, private or public reprimand, and/or suspension from one or more future scheduled events.
- 404.9 Except in cases specified in Sections 402.1.5 the home team will be responsible for obtaining and paying an official, an umpire, two line judges and scorer, as deemed qualified in Section 404.

405 Video exchange policy

- 405.1 EIVA member institutions must adhere to the EIVA video exchange policy, found as appendix B.
- 405.2 Matches need to be uploaded into our web-based video exchange system by the end of the next day after the conclusion of each match.
- 405.3 All institutions must submit their match schedule to our SID & to our web-based video exchange system by the specified date.

406 Scouting

- 406.1 Live scouting of EIVA opponents is prohibited except as provided in NCAA By-laws 11.6.1.1 and 11.6.1.2.
- 406.2 The EIVA recognizes there are no such prohibitions when one or more of the involved institutions are Division II or Division III. It is thereby recommended that if, in such cases, a coach of an EIVA school wishes to scout an EIVA opponent that the coach should be

given complementary admission to the event, provided the scouting coach gives ample notice that he/she will be in attendance.

406.3 EIVA member institutions are prohibited from giving information of any kind on fellow EIVA members to non-conference schools.

407 Sponsorships and affiliations

- 407.1 Molten USA and the Molten V5M5000-3N Flistatec NCAA red/white/blue premium composite Volleyball is the official volleyball of the EIVA.
- 407.2 VolleyMetrics is the official video exchange system of the EIVA and E-scoresheet is mandatory for league-wide use.
- 407.3 All EIVA sponsorships and affiliations must occur through the EIVA Commissioner. Only the EIVA Commissioner may sign contracts with third party organizations.

408 General regulations

408.1 Forfeits

- 408.1.1 If a team fails to appear for a scheduled contracted Division or Championship/Playoff match, the contest will be forfeited and entered as a loss in the official Division standings.
 - 408.1.1.1 USA/NCAA Volleyball rules regarding forfeits will be enforced, unless a representative of the potentially-forfeiting team contacts the host institution prior to the scheduled starting time for the contest.
 - 408.1.1.1.1 In the event of a visiting team's anticipated late arrival, the Head Coaches of the visiting team and the host institution should mutually agree upon a redefined start time, under the following circumstances:
 - a. If the visiting team has made a good faith effort and has shown up late,
 - b. It is expected that the late arriving team has made every effort possible to contact the host institution,
 - c. The home team will make an effort to contact the visiting team's institution.
 - 408.1.1.1.2 EIVA members should, in cases in which contact is made as described in 408.1.1.1, grant leniency in enforcement of forfeit rules.
 - 408.1.2 In the event of forfeiture in which the services of official have been obtained (and therefore must be paid for), the forfeiting teams will make full payment for the officials for the forfeited match(s) as contracted by the home team.

- 408.1.3 NCAA Rules state that canceled matches (those in which teams mutually agree that there will no match played) are not forfeits, and cannot be counted as wins/losses.
- 408.2 Postponements
 - 408.2.1 Changes in either the date or time of competition or the teams competing may only occur with the unanimous consent of the teams shown on the schedule of competition as competing against each other on that date.
 - 408.2.2 If, due to unforeseen circumstances, an EIVA team finds it impossible to compete on a particular date or time and the unanimous consent of the other scheduled teams to change the date or time of competition cannot be obtained, notice of inability to compete is required a minimum of 24 hours in advance to all EIVA teams scheduled to compete on that date. Failure to comply with this rule will result in a forfeit of the matches involved and a \$400.00 fine. The fine will be paid by check to the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association and mailed to the treasurer of the Association. The question of "forseeability", if disputed, will be resolved by the Executive Director.
 - 408.2.3 An exception to the requirement of 24 hours notice is unexpected weather or road conditions that are so severe that travel is unsafe. The need for evaluation of situations requiring additional exceptions may be considered by the Executive Committee.
- 408.3 If a team is unable to continue its season because of extenuating circumstances (e.g., injuries); all the results from the matches it played will be deleted from the standings of the EIVA. Those results should remain part of the opposing teams' overall records, and should be listed when reporting season information to the EIVA and the NCAA; they simply have no impact on the final standings for determining Playoff selection.
- 408.4 Host institutions should reserve reasonable space for visiting team's media and radio broadcasters.
- 408.5 The EIVA does not have a general policy for complimentary passes for in-season competition between conference teams. EIVA members will adhere to the guidelines as stated in NCAA Bylaw 16, section 2.
 - 408.5.1 If two schools mutually agree to provide complimentary passes between the schools, they have the right to distribute them.
 - 408.5.2 It is recommended for schools that charge admission to matches that complementary passes be provided for the family of the visiting coach.

- 408.6 It is strongly recommended that security appropriate to the magnitude of the event and anticipated crowd size be provided by the host institution.
- 408.7 It is recommended that each school should provide the following information by December to opponents:
1. Directions to the college/university and playing facility
 2. The name, phone number, location of a contact person upon arrival
 3. Descriptions of any pre-match or post-match refreshments to be provided
 4. A list of hotels/motels in the area
 5. A list of area restaurant choices for post-match meals
 6. Any specific parking information relevant to the host campus and playing facility
 7. Training room availability, services, and supplies provided by the host team
 8. Pertinent video capturing information (e.g., if extension cords are needed).
 9. Any other pertinent information to help make the visiting team's visit complication free
 10. A phone number to call in case of emergency. This number should be either campus security or some other number that is always answered.
- 408.8 Teams are to submit their team schedules to the EIVA SID by the specified date to assist the SID in completing the EIVA Master Schedule.
- 408.9 Each team must complete and submit all the box scores & required reporting form to the EIVA SID at the specified dates.

PART 5: MATCH AND EVENT SITE GUIDELINES

500 Rules of competition

- 500.1 Competition among members of the EIVA will be governed by current official rules of USA Volleyball (USAV) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) unless superseded by EIVA rules (See Appendix E for complete list.).
- 500.2 All conference, EIVA matches will consist of the best of five sets. First four sets to 25, the fifth, if necessary, to 15; all wins by at least 2 points.
- 500.3 Coaching from the bench is permitted.

501 Match Protocol.

- 501.1 All EIVA matches must adhere to the EIVA match protocol.
- 501.2 It is required that all coaches share the protocol information with officials and have it available at all matches.
- 501.3 EIVA Prematch protocol will be found as Appendix C following the Constitution and Bylaws.

502 Playing facilities

- 502.1 It is expected that the playing area specifications meet the requirements for Nationally Sanctioned USA Volleyball events, as found in Chapter 1 of the USA Volleyball rulebook.
- 502.2 It is expected that the playing area be safe and clearly marked in order to minimize liability situations, enhance the quality of play, and insure a level of court consistency.
- 502.3 It is expected that a scoreboard be located in an easily visible location to enhance the quality of play and promote an enjoyable atmosphere for spectators.

503 Official Ball

- 503.1 The Molten V5M5000-3N Flistatec NCAA red/white/blue premium composite volleyball must be provided for all conference matches and all EIVA sponsored tournaments. If not used the home team will forfeit the match.
- 503.2 EIVA matches will use the three-ball system
 - 503.2.1 A different ball should be used for each rally.
 - 503.2.2 The two balls not in play are held by ball persons in the endline positions, one on each side of the court.
 - 503.2.3 Balls are circulated to the person in the endline position who does not have a ball during play. Balls are always rolled from corner to middle to corner. This circulation is done as fast and as inconspicuously as possible.
 - 503.2.4 When not chasing or rolling balls shaggers should place themselves in a place in which they will not interfere with match play and out of sight lines of spectators.

504 Scorekeepers

- 504.1 The home team will provide a scorer.
 - 504.1.1 The scorekeeper should be qualified to keep score of high-level volleyball.
- 504.2 Scoring will be accomplished on the agreed upon EIVA scoring sheet (e-sheet). The home team will be responsible for the scorekeeping system.
- 504.3 The home team will provide copies of match score files for visiting teams at the conclusion of the match.
- 504.4 The use of a libero tracker for EIVA matches is not required, and is left up to the discretion of the host institution.

505 Statistics


505.1 The home team will provide the NCAA box score form produced by sports information staff knowledgeable of NCAA volleyball statistics to keep the match stats.

505.2 The home team will provide match statistics to the visiting team using EIVA/NCAA approved Box Score systems at the conclusion of the match.

506 Uniforms

506.1 For EIVA conference matches, the home teams shall wear light colored jerseys on Friday and dark colored jerseys on Saturday. Jersey colors must be contrasting. If the visiting team is unable to comply with the color rotation the visiting coach must prearrange with the home coach in order that the home team may wear contrasting uniforms.

Appendix A: AVCA Coaches Code of Ethics and Conduct

PRINCIPLE—PROLOGUE/CREED

As a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA), I am committed to sound educational processes, establishing traditions and promoting values for my volleyball community. I am dedicated to advancing the welfare of those who seek my assistance and to the maintenance of high standards of professional conduct and competence. I am accountable for all of my actions and to this Code of Ethics, and my acceptance of this fiduciary responsibility is expressed in all of my personal and professional relationships in that coaching may involve my direction of youth, adolescent or adult teams. I will follow these principles in all environments and abide by them completely when coaching.

PRINCIPLE 1—PROFESSIONAL PRACTICES

I pledge to maintain practices that protect the public and advance my profession; I will:

- A. Maintain responsible association with USA Volleyball, its national programs and member organizations.
- B. Continue personal and professional growth, remaining current on new developments in the field through continuing education.
- C. Use my knowledge and professional association(s) for the benefit of the people I serve.
- D. Always strive to be truthful and put colleagues or other professionals in a positive light.
- E. Avoid discrimination in all of its forms.

PRINCIPLE 2—COACH/ATHLETE RELATIONSHIPS

I pledge to maintain relationships on a professional basis; I will:

- A. Conduct all my relationships from a perspective of dignity and sound educational and scientific foundation to:
 - 1. Direct comments or criticism relative to the performance, not the athlete.
 - 2. Ensure that all activities are suitable for the age, experience and ability of the athletes.
 - 3. Educate athletes as to their responsibilities in contributing to a safe environment, and to do my best to ensure that all facilities and equipment meet safety standards and that they are ageability appropriate.
 - 4. Consider the athlete's future health and well being as foremost when making decisions regarding an injured athlete's ability to continue

competing or training, and seek professional medical opinions to serve as a basis for my decisions.

5. Be aware of academic responsibilities; conduct practices and match schedules in a manner so as not to unduly interfere with academic success. Never encourage, condone, or require any behavior that threatens an athlete's high school, USA Volleyball, collegiate eligibility or amateur status.
 6. Comply with regulations and ethical guidelines for recruiting practices as defined by governing sport organizations.
 7. Strive to develop individual and team respect for the ability of opponents.
 8. Prioritize being present at all practices and competitions and, when unable to, assure knowledgeable and safe supervision.
- B. Work with and strive to develop every member of the team.
- C. Show sensitive regard to the moral, social, religious and sexual orientations of others and communities. I will not impose my beliefs on others.
- D. Recognize the trust placed in, and the unique power of, the coach and athlete relationship. I will not exploit the dependency of athletes and will avoid dual relationships (e.g., business or close personal relationships) which could impair my professional judgment, compromise the integrity of the process and/or take advantage of the relationship for my own gain.
- E. While serving in a professional capacity or role model, avoid any drug, tobacco or alcohol use while in the presence of athletes. I will discourage by way of education any consumption of these substances by minors and will remain at all times within the limits of the law with regard to legal substances. I will avoid illegal substances entirely.
- F. Not engage in physical, verbal, or emotional harassment, abusive words or actions, or exploitative coercion of current or former athletes. I will report any suspected cases of abuse to the appropriate authorities immediately.
- G. Recognize that all forms of sexual abuse, assault or harassment with athletes are illegal and unethical, even when an athlete invites or consents to such behavior or involvement. Sexual abuse and harassment is defined as, but not limited to, repeated comments, gestures or physical contacts of a sexual nature. I will report all suspected cases of sexual assault or abuse to law enforcement as required by law.

PRINCIPLE III—CONFIDENTIALITY

I will respect the integrity and protect the welfare of all persons with whom I am working and pledge to safeguard information about them that has been learned or obtained during the coaching relationship, including performance reviews, statistics and all personal confidences. Further, I will obtain permission from athletes before sharing video recordings or other data of them with anyone excepting the recognized coaching staff; when current or former athletes are

referred to in a publication, while teaching or in a public presentation that is not laudatory, their identity will be thoroughly disguised. The only exception to this will be that I will not use these standards of confidentiality to avoid intervention when it is necessary (e.g., when there is evidence of physical or psychological abuse of minors, or legal issues).

PRINCIPLE IV—STAFF/EMPLOYEE RELATIONSHIPS

All relationships with employees and staff will be maintained on a professional and confidential basis, and I will avoid exploiting their trust and dependency.

The Code of Ethics is a condition of membership in the AVCA. All members will be provided a copy of the Code as part of their membership application. To qualify for membership, an applicant must sign a statement acknowledging having read the Code and subscribing to the principles of the Code.

Appendix B: League video specifications and guidelines

EXCHANGE RULES

REGULAR SEASON

- A. VolleyMetrics is the official video sharing service of the EIVA.
- B. There will be no film or video exchange or scouting reports given to non-conference schools on any match that involves two institutional members of the EIVA.
- C. Videos of matches may be downloaded at any time by any institution; however, a program must be current in their own uploading of match videos to be able to download others.
- D. All uploads must be made on the official EIVA Video Exchange Website. Each match upload must be done no later than 24 hours after conclusion.
- E. Each institution is allowed to download as many matches from each opponent during the playing year as long as they are current in their own.
- F. If a team does not comply with uploading matches, they are not allowed to download videos from any opponent.
- G. If a technical problem occurs with the videotaping of a match, so that the video is not available to upload or is unsuitable for viewing, the responsible institution will contact the opponent and the Executive Director immediately.

PLAYOFFS

- A. All teams playing in the EIVA quarterfinal matches must be current in their uploads so that opponents can download the latest matches.
- B. All teams participating in the EIVA semifinal matches need to have their quarterfinal matches uploaded so that the opponent can download them.
- B. All teams participating in the EIVA Final match need to have their Semifinal matches uploaded so that the opponent can download them.

6:40 – 6:45	20:00 – 15:00	Home team on court – no ball handling by visiting team.
6:45 – 6:50	15:00 – 10:00	Visiting team on court– no ball handling by home team.
6:50 – 6:55	10:00 – 05:00	Home team on court – no ball handling by visiting team.
6:55 – 7:00	05:00 – 00:00	Team to benches, national anthem, player introductions.
7:00		Match starts.

2. Pre-match, provide the following:

- a. lockers/meeting-room for visiting teams
- b. 12 volleyballs per team for pre-match warm up
- c. water at each bench
- d. towels for wiping the floor during the match
- e. towels for bench use
- f. public address announcer for introductions
- g. national anthem

3. Match management

- a. use 3-ball system
- b. provide 4 ball shaggers while teams are hitting for warm up
- c. EIVA certified referees and lines people
- d. all time-outs will be one (1) minute in length
- e. all breaks between sets will be three (3) minutes in length ; up to ten (10) minutes break between sets two & three only allowed with prior notification to visiting team Head Coach

4. Post match

- a. provide a list of hotels/motels in the area
