Bethesda's pastoral team has been working together for almost 4 1/2 years. We've experienced a lot in that time with staffing changes and working with little support staff. We each picked up different pieces that were dropped by the staffing changes and we kept working and plugging ahead. One of the things that suffered during this time was our team building. We struggled to meet together regularly, we did have an occasional retreat but for the most part, we each did our own thing. Early this year, with the approval of the CPC, we brought in a consultant to work with the three of us and help us chart a new path forward. This was an important moment because it allowed each of us to recommit to our shared ministry and to begin to plot a course forward.

As your pastors, we are committed to meet together weekly for the purpose of checking in with each other personally, identifying areas that need our focus and attention, making decisions that need all three of our input, and praying with and for one another. This has been an important addition to our weekly routine. Beyond this meeting, we are scheduling time to delve deeper into subjects like worship, communications, and defining each of our roles in a way that we haven't before. 
pastors@bethesdalutheranchurch.com. We can then address the concern or idea at our next

Personnel Updates

During the past year, we have made a couple changes in staff positions and this article will serve as some information about those changes.

About a year ago, Bill Vaughan was hired as our custodian. The most common question I get is, "Why does the custodian need an office?" When we hired Bill, we didn't change his title but we significantly changed the job description. While the primary focus is still on the cleanliness of the building, Bill also brings a lot of maintenance experience to the position, a willingness to walk the park for garbage and other items that get left behind, and a willingness to clean the outdoor restroom. Bill has an office because he frequently needs a phone to call contractors and volunteers, computer access to order supplies and to do research on the best practices for caring for the many different surfaces in the building. Bill's presence also brings a little peace of mind to our preschool teachers because he is quick to respond to people loitering in the park or making the environment feel less safe for the children and parents as they drop off and pick up their children. Bill, with the property team, also coordinates volunteers to get some of the maintenance tasks done that he is unable to do. Bill has been a helpful addition to our staff and helps greatly with the daily workflow of the building.

Just a couple of months ago, we hired Stephanie Kinnaman as our Administrative Coordinator. This is a very part-time position at 15 hours. Stephanie is settling in to the position but she still has days where it feels like she is, "drinking from a firehose." Her position entails a wide variety of tasks, including: coordinating the front desk volunteers, managing projects that flow out of the office (like the directory that was done entirely "in house"), updating the many forms that we use, coordinating the scheduling of rooms and spaces in the building, ordering office supplies and a whole host of other things. Stephanie's presence has also given the pastors space to meet more effectively. With her 15 hour work week, Stephanie will be in the office on different days each week. This is not to confuse people but so that she can have time each week to make sure the volunteers are comfortable with their duties as assigned. Stephanie is working to make sure that her schedule is posted outside of her office for the current week and the next week so that if you need to talk to her, you know when she will be at the office. Stephanie has added greatly to the productivity and organization of the church office.

We also have a couple of "contract" employees. Both Laurie Bullard, our Business Manager and Deanna Rivera, our Communications Coordinator, are contracted employees. What this means for Bethesda is that we pay them an agreed amount of money monthly to care for their specific areas of ministry. Both Laurie and Deanna are business owners and they work under contract for our congregation because they are members here and want to see Bethesda grow and thrive. That being said, the expectation from the CPC and the pastoral staff is that they will execute the duties of their contract faithfully and diligently but we also recognize that because they are business owners some deadlines may need to be pushed and responses can take longer at certain times. As a CPA, Laurie works many extra hours leading up to tax day and she may not be able to answer more complicated questions because of the time needed to prepare the proper answer. As the owner of UplinkSpyder, Deanna is continually working to bring in new business and do very high quality work for her clients, this means that occasionally a project may need a little extra time for the church and it may even mean that she can't do a specific project for an event. We have agreed to these minimal trade offs because we know that we are getting quality work at a value under what the market demands. We appreciate their willingness to serve the congregation in this way.

Over the next several weeks, the Personnel Committee will be conducting annual reviews of all of the staff. Feel free to ask them any questions you might have or share any concerns you might have. The Personnel Committee is made up of: Allen Stutheit, 2nd Vice-President of the CPC and chair of the Committee, Mim Baker, Jim Embree, Dick Brown, and Julie Gilbert. Pastor Steve and Laurel Horton, President of the CPC, serve as advisory members of the committee. The CPC is in charge of the contracted employees. Hopefully this is helpful information and clarifies some of the questions that have been asked.

Greetings from the CPC and your Treasurer. With summer here we want to update you on the year of giving thus far. Our current giving through April was \$156,532 and our expenditures \$188,392. In April we only had a deficit of \$3,861, so that average is coming down!

As we continue to move toward a balanced annual budget, we encourage everyone to automate their giving. The Church has a simple online giving/donation link you can find on our website using the "donate" button. This allows for one time or recurring gifts. We are also very excited to introduce a new convenient way to automate your giving through our "Text to Give" option. Simply text an amount to 541-227-2274 and the first time, you will be prompted to set up an account. From there you can automate your monthly giving and have the ability to donate from your phone whenever you want.

A Season for Re-Creative Rest

"Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." ~Matthew 11:28-30

If you are connected to the school year, the summer promises a change of pace. For some this means rest; for parents it might mean school-year busyness is replaced with childcare challenges or increasingly stir-crazy kids.

Jesus promises rest to the laboring and heavyladen, but does this liken discipleship to an endless summer break? Far from it. The rest Christ offers is not a rest from work. He points to a team of oxen in which an older is yoked to a younger. The soul finds rest in shared labor. The work is not toilsome, and the team can accomplish far more together than in isolation. The younger trusts that the older will lead them in the right work and demonstrate how to do it well.

Jesus removes our heavy loads of sin and turns us from the ruts we have plowed ourselves into. He replaces our labor to be loved with a labor to love the unlovable. Martin Luther describes it this way: "The yoke that Christ lays upon us is sweet and his burden is light. When sin has been forgiven and the conscience has been liberated from the burden and the sting of sin, then a Christian can bear everything easily. Because everything within is sweet and pleasant, he willingly does and suffers everything."

This summer, seek not a rest from labor. Seek the shared labor in the Lord which makes our conscience light and our steps sure. "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58).

Priority is given to applicants who have been accepted to a Lutheran college or university.


