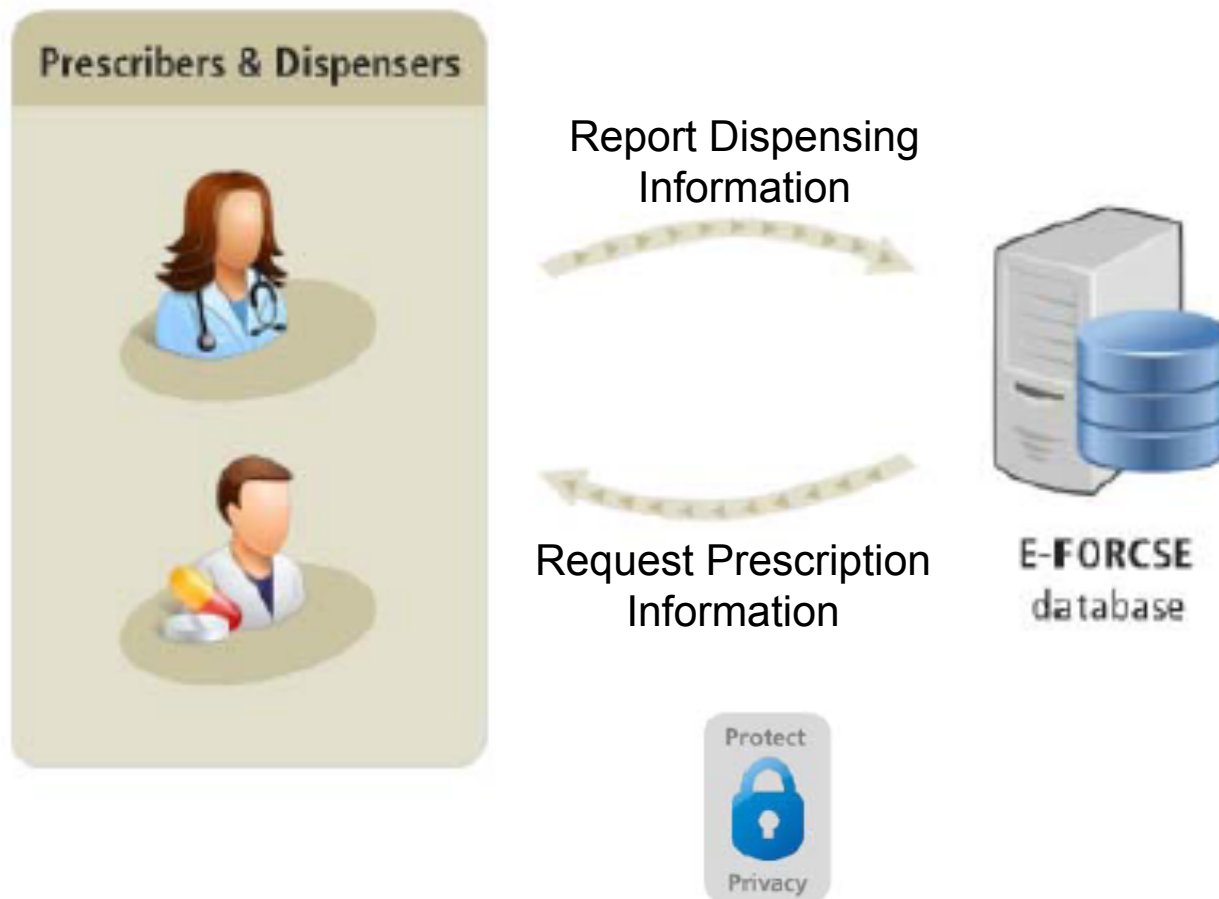

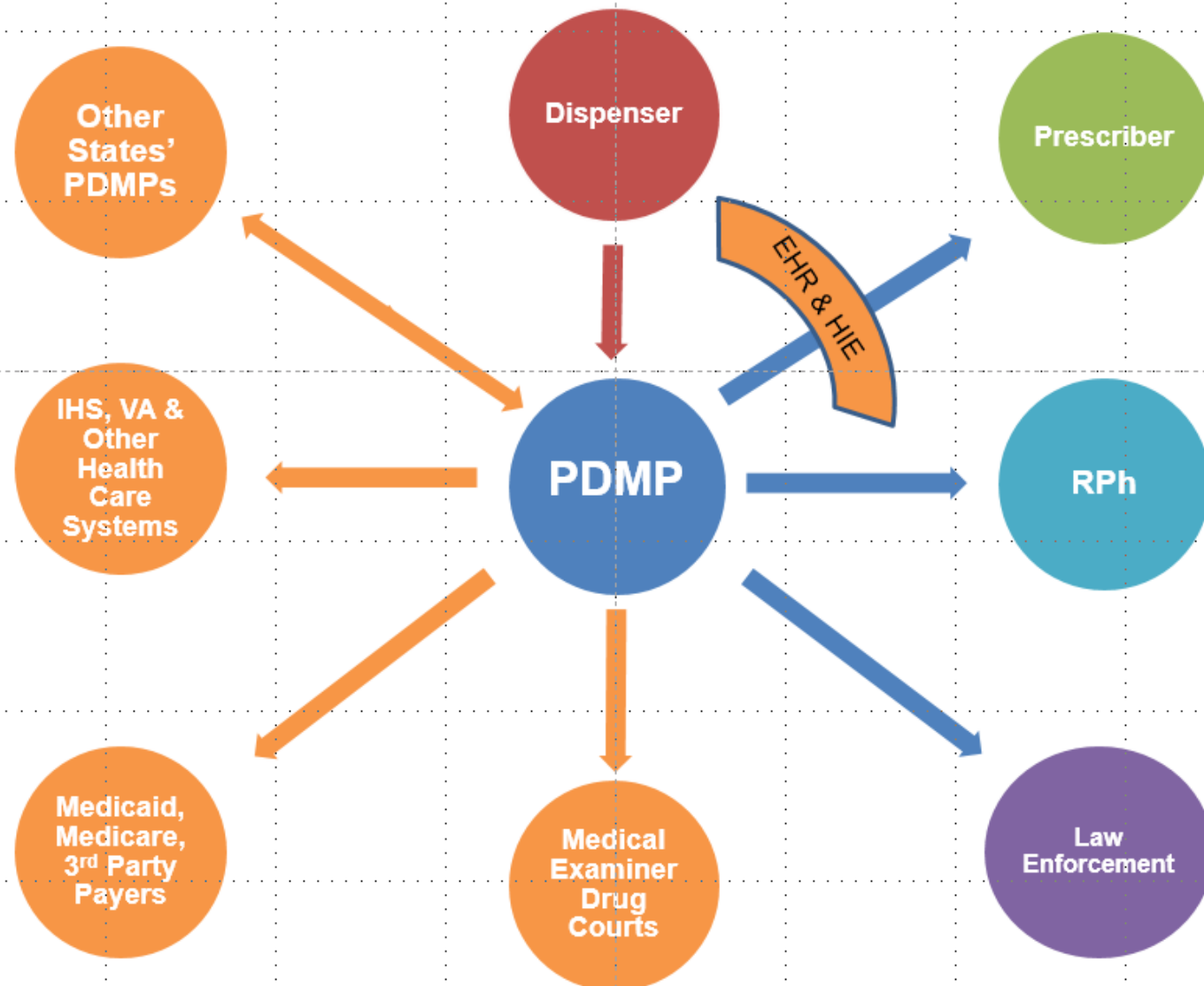
What are the Goals of the PDMP?

- To encourage safer prescribing and dispensing of controlled substances and to reduce drug abuse and diversion within the state of Florida.
- To provide information collected in the database to health care practitioners to guide clinical decisions in prescribing and dispensing highly-abused prescription drugs.¹

What is E-FORCSE?



How do PDMPs work?



Dispenser Reporting Requirements

- Pharmacies and dispensing practitioners must report no later than the close of next business day
- Mandatory reporting began September 1, 2011
- >200 MILLION records in database*

* As of May 31, 2017

Penalty for Non-Compliance

- Failing to report the dispensing of a controlled substance is a **first degree misdemeanor**
- Compliance Audit revealed 96% of dispensers reported within 7 days

Dispensing Information Reported

- Patient
 - Name, Address, Date of Birth, Prescription Information, Payment Type, Telephone Number
- Prescriber
 - Name, Address, DEA Number
- Pharmacy
 - Name, Address, DEA Number

Controlled Substance Information Not Reported to the Database

- If ***administered*** directly to a patient
- If ***administered*** or ***dispensed*** to a patient less than 16 years of age;
- If ***administered*** or ***dispensed*** in the health care system of the Department of Corrections;
- If ***dispensed*** by a Department of Defense facility

Data Integrity Reduces Inadvertent Red Flags: Accuracy is important

Dispenser Reporting

- Patient's first and last names
 - Spelling/Nicknames
 - Hyphenated names
- Address completeness
- Extraneous notes in reporting fields
- Edit and void changes
 - Quantity/Prescriber edits
 - "Return to Shelf"

Why it is important?

- ✓ Decreases multiple profiles
- ✓ Determines the blending of the patient's records
- ✓ Expedites patient search results
- ✓ Reflects actual dispensing
- ✓ Enhances sound clinical decisions

Reporting Discrepancies

- Dispenser uploading data is responsible for editing incorrect information
 - Return to Stock
 - Prescription Entry Typos/Errors
 - Change in Quantities
- Errors and omissions must be corrected within 7 business days after discovery

How is the information used?

- Prescribers, pharmacies and pharmacists use the information from E-FORCSE to improve health care outcomes.
- Reports can supplement a patient evaluation, confirm the patient's prescription history, document compliance with a therapeutic regimen, and identify potentially hazardous or fatal interactions.



Florida's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program

Registration Information

Authority for Access to the E-FORCSE Database Information

- Section 893.0551, FS authorizes direct access by a pharmacy, prescriber, dispenser licensed by the Department of Health or their designee
- “Designee” means a person preferably a licensed or certified health care professional, appointed to act as an agent of a prescriber or dispenser for the purposes of requesting or receiving information from the PDMP.
- Enrollment and use of the database is not mandatory prior to prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance

E-FORCSE Patient Information: Security and Privacy

- Section 893.0551, F.S., any person who willfully and knowingly violates this section of law by sharing confidential protected health information commits a felony of the third degree
- Felony convictions related to Chapter 893, F.S. can result in licensure non-renewal
- Board of Pharmacy sanctions have included \$10,000 fine, laws and rules, ethics, no PDM for 1 year

Overview of the Designee Process

- Credentialed and registered prescriber or dispenser selects a licensed or registered health care professional established under Chapter 456 or if necessary, another appropriate person in their practice to act on their behalf as a designee.
- **Designee must complete the online training,** register and be linked to a prescriber or dispenser Master Account holder
- Designee must be directly supervised by the linked prescriber or dispenser.

Welcome Practitioners, Pharmacists, Enforcement and Investigative Agencies to E-FORCSE, the Florida Prescription Drug Monitoring Program.

The Florida Prescription Drug Monitoring Program, known as E-FORCSE® (Electronic-Florida Online Reporting of Controlled Substance Evaluation Program), was created by the 2009 Florida Legislature in an initiative to encourage safer prescribing of controlled substances and to reduce drug abuse and diversion within the state of Florida. E-FORCSE® has selected Health Information Designs, LLC, to develop a database that collects and stores prescribing and dispensing data for controlled substances in Schedules II, III, and IV. Section 893.055, Florida Statutes, requires health care practitioners to report to the PDMP each time a controlled substance is dispensed to an individual. The information is reported through the electronic system as soon as possible but not more than 7 days after dispensing. This reporting timeframe ensures that health care practitioners have the most up-to-date information available.



In addition to practitioners and pharmacists, a law enforcement agency may request confidential controlled substance dispensing information in the database during active investigations regarding potential criminal activity, fraud, or theft regarding prescribed controlled substances and that has entered into a user agreement with the Department. Also the Department of Health Investigative Services Unit and Medicaid Fraud Unit investigators may request information in the database to aide in the investigation of cases involving controlled substances.

Query Creation Tip

Make your query as general as possible and then drill down to more specific information once you have identified the person for whom you are looking. For example, you could enter the last name of the individual, the first letter of the first name, and a birth date, and then click Next. When the preliminary results are displayed on the screen, you can highlight the person that you want to query and then click Submit to submit the query for processing.

If you enter a specific birth date for an individual and the query results are blank, click the Within field just below the Date of Birth field and resubmit the query with a wider date range, for example, within two years of birth date, to create a query with broader search criteria.

Once you have submitted the query for processing, you will be redirected to the Report Queue. In the Report Queue, click the Job Sequence ID number to view the report you requested. If the Job Sequence ID is not a hyperlink, click your browser's refresh button. The Job Sequence ID will appear as a hyperlink when the report is ready for viewing.

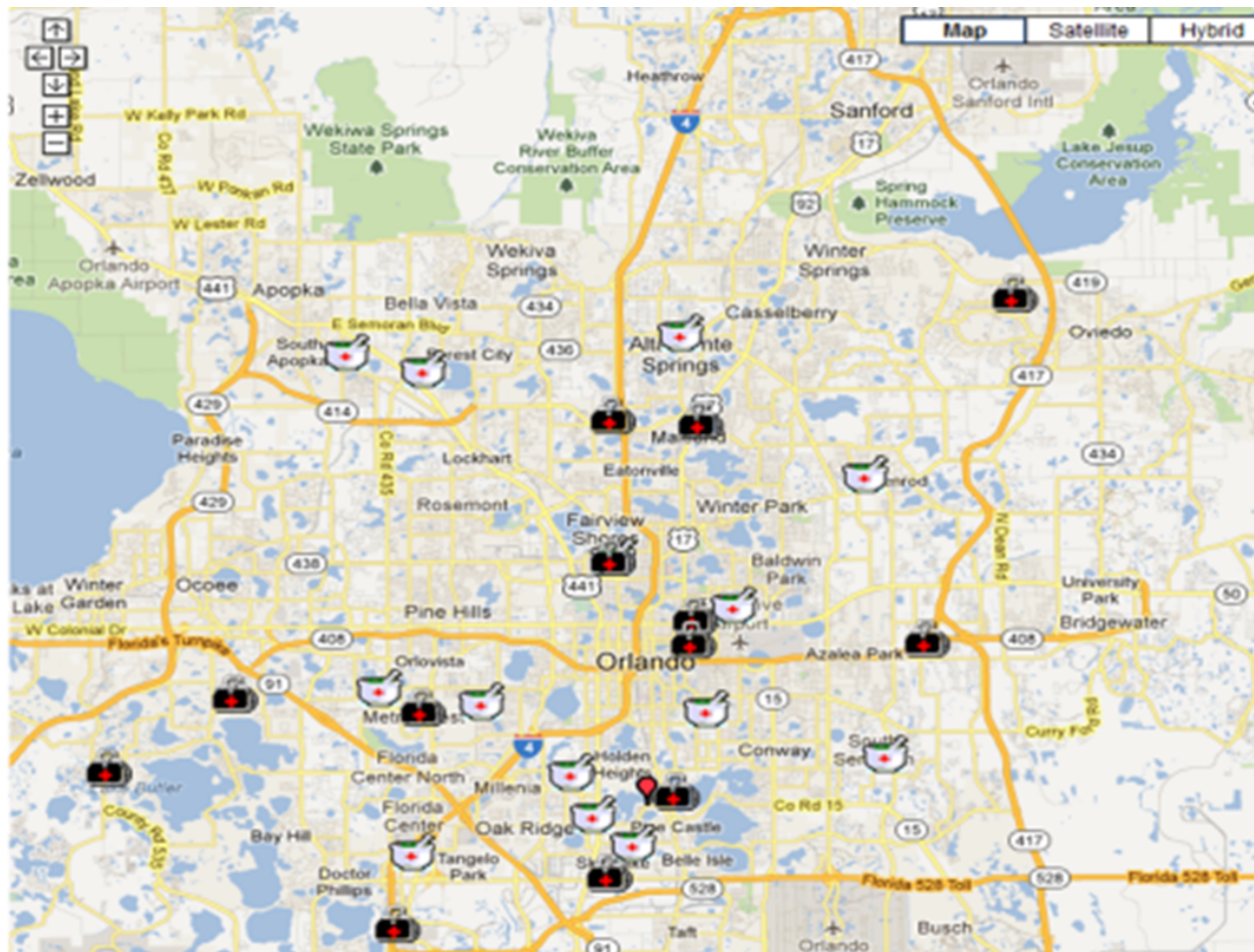

Proactive Reporting Authorization

- Florida Administrative Code Rule 64K-1.007 *Indicators of Controlled Substance Abuse* authorizes the PDMP to provide relevant information to the health care practitioner if the patient, within a 90-day period, has:
 - Visited more than 1 prescriber
 - Obtained medication from more than 5 pharmacies

Purpose of Proactive Reporting

- Provides a comprehensive approach to address diversion, misuse and abuse
- Supports coordinated care and potential noncompliance allowing the physician to focus on concerns

Proactive Reporting Notification

- Reviewed quarterly by staff
- Reports will identify individuals obtaining controlled substance prescriptions from multiple prescribers and multiple dispensers
- Only relevant information will be provided to health care practitioners
