

SYMPOSIUM LEARNING OUTCOME STATEMENT

JOHN PRESTON DARBY, MD

Pamela Darby, MSN, RN, ACNS-BC, FNP-C, developed the Dr. John Preston Darby Educational Symposium as a tribute to her late husband to honor his outstanding legacy in medicine, as well as to advance medical knowledge.



A native of Columbia, S.C., “Pres” Darby graduated from Medical College of South Carolina in 1954. He then entered the U.S. Air Force, where he completed his residency and fellowship training and later served as a flight surgeon based at Hickam AFB in Hawaii. After leaving the Air Force, he started his internal medicine practice in Big Spring in 1964 before moving in 1969 to San Angelo, where he practiced until retiring in 2004. To this day, former patients remark about his exceptional diagnostic skills, charm and compassion for patients of all ages, but particularly for his elderly patients.

In addition to his professional practice, Darby was also a humanitarian. He volunteered his services in clinics along the Texas-Mexico border, as well as in Guyana, Honduras and the Philippines. In 1985, he volunteered to serve with Afghanistan’s mujahedeen resistance fighters following the Soviet invasion. He later returned to Afghanistan in 1992 and 2005, and he co-founded International Orphan Care, which established clinics and orphanages in the war-ravaged country.

A true renaissance man, Darby also enjoyed acting in local theatre, backpacking, flying, scuba


diving, fishing and physical fitness activities. He had six children. But in 2003, he received the devastating news that he suffered from ALS (Lou Gehrig’s disease). Despite the terminal diagnosis, he faced it with the same conviction to living life fully that he displayed in his profession, love of his family and giving to others. After a lengthy battle, Darby passed away on March 14, 2011.

Darby’s legacy in the medical community will live on through the symposium that bears his name and through the nurse practitioner student scholarships it supports.

Paul K. Carlton Jr., MD, FACS
Dr. Paul Carlton Jr. is a retired lieutenant general of the U.S. Air Force Medical Corps who also served as a professor of surgery at the Texas A&M University Health Science Center. He specializes in general surgery and disaster management, and he continues to serve as a consultant on medical preparedness at the Texas A&M HSC. After earning his medical degree from the University of Colorado School of Medicine, Dr. Carlton did his residency in general surgery at Wilford Hall Medical Center on Lackland AFB in San Antonio. He has completed courses in hyperbaric oxygen, aerospace medicine, advanced trauma life support and hospital management. He also instructed courses on combat casualty care and advanced cardiac life support. He is certified by the American Board of Surgery.



Glenn M. Ihde, MD
Dr. Glenn Ihde is a physician at West Texas Medical Associates in the General Surgery Department. He earned his medical degree from the University of Kansas and is board certified by the American Board of Surgery. After graduating from KU, he went to the University of Kansas-Wichita, where he specialized in minimally invasive surgical techniques. In practice since 1998, Dr. Ihde has concentrated on further developing minimally invasive techniques in weight-loss surgery and has developed an incisionless procedure to treat acid reflux (also known as GERD). He is recognized as a leader in reflux surgery and has served as president of the Texas Association for Bariatric Surgery. In addition to his specialized areas, he continues to provide basic general surgical care.



Lance Read, DDS
Dr. Lance Read is chief of the Dental Department and director of the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Baylor Scott & White Clinic in Temple. He received his dental degree from the Baylor College of Dentistry, where he also completed a four-year residency in oral and maxillofacial surgery and one-year oral surgery externship before his residency. Dr. Read spent three years in the U.S. Navy, reaching the rank of lieutenant commander, and nine additional years in the Navy Reserves. He specializes in dental implants, oral pathology, orthognathic surgery, surgical treatment for sleep apnea, cleft lip and palate, trauma repair, TMJ surgery and wisdom tooth extraction. He is board certified by the American Association of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeons and is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery.
