

# Lynn Gallagher-Ford, PhD, RN, DPFNAP, NE-BC Director, Center for Transdisciplinary EB Practice The Ohio State University



**Lynn Gallagher-Ford**, PhD, RN, DPFNAP, NE-BC, is Director of the Center for Transdisciplinary Evidence-based Practice at The Ohio State University, College of Nursing where her work is dedicated to research, education, and consultation focused on the development, promotion, integration, implementation, and sustainability of evidence-based practice in both academic and clinical settings.

Gallagher-Ford's clinical background in maternal child health and nursing administration has spanned 30 years in which she has served in a variety of roles ranging from bedside clinician to chief nursing officer where she gained extensive experience and expertise in teaching and implementing evidence-based practice in real world clinical settings. Currently active as a consultant, facilitator, and keynote presenter at national and international conferences and education programs, she has co-authored the book *Implementing the EBP Competencies in Healthcare; A Practical Guide for Improving Quality, Safety and Outcomes*.

Her publications include co-authorship of multiple studies conducted that have dramatically impacted the current body of knowledge about evidence-based practice and influenced strategic imperatives to address new challenges.

- •A National Survey of Nurse in Professional Development that looked at current realities related to: demographics, priorities, evidence-based practice attributes and competencies, benchmarked metrics and outcomes.
- •A National Survey of Nurse Executives that looked at current realities related to: demographics, priorities, evidence-based practice attributes and investment, benchmarked metrics and outcomes.
- •A Delphi Study that established essential EBP competencies for practicing RNs and APNs.
- •A National Survey of US Nurses that revealed an updated assessment of "The State of Evidence-Based Practice in US Nurses: Critical Implications for Nurse Leaders and Educators".

Gallagher-Ford's research is focused on the science behind evidence-based practice with particular focus on the influence of nurse leaders and contextual issues. She was inducted into the National Academies of Practice and the Nursing Academy as a Distinguished Practitioner and Fellow in 2013.




