A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 nurses, so as to transfer the Georgia Board of Nursing from the jurisdiction of the Secretary
- 3 of State to the Department of Community Health for administrative purposes only; to provide
- 4 for a definition; to provide for the powers and duties of the board; to authorize the board to
- 5 appoint an executive director; to provide for the powers and duties of such executive director;
- 6 to revise certain provisions related to the division director; to provide for related matters; to
- 7 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to nurses, is
- amended in Code Section 43-26-3, relating to definitions relative to the "Georgia Registered
- 12 Professional Nurse Practice Act," by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:
- 13 "(3.1) 'Executive director' means the executive director appointed by the board pursuant
- 14 <u>to Code Section 43-26-4.1."</u>
- SECTION 2.
- 16 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 17 "<u>43-26-4.1.</u>
- 18 (a) The board shall not be under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of State but shall be an
- 19 <u>independent state agency assigned to the Department of Community Health for</u>
- 20 <u>administrative purposes only, as provided in Code Section 50-4-3, except that such</u>
- 21 <u>department shall prepare and submit the budget for the board. The board shall have, with</u>
- 22 respect to all matters within the jurisdiction of the board as provided under this chapter, the
- 23 powers, duties, and functions of professional licensing boards as provided in Chapter 1 of
- 24 this title.

25 (b) The board shall appoint and fix the compensation of an executive director of such board who shall serve at the pleasure of the board. The executive director shall have those 26 27 duties and powers prescribed by the board and any power, duty, and function granted to the 28 division director with respect to professional licensing boards under Chapter 1 of this 29 title but shall not be subject to any approval or other powers exercised by the Secretary of 30 State. 31 (c) Meetings and hearings of the board shall be held at the site of the office of the board or at such other site as may be specified by the president of the board. A majority of the 32 33 members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business of the board. 34 (d) The board, through the executive director, may hire investigators for the purpose of conducting investigations. Any person so employed, if a P.O.S.T. certified peace officer 35 36 under Chapter 8 of Title 35, shall be considered to be a peace officer and shall have all 37 powers, duties, and status of a peace officer of this state; provided, however, that such investigators shall only be authorized, upon written approval of the executive director, 38 39 notwithstanding Code Sections 16-11-126 and 16-11-129, to carry firearms in the 40 performance of their duties and exercise the powers of arrest in the performance of their 41 duties. 42 (e) The venue of any action involving members of the board shall be the county in which 43 is found the primary office of the governmental entity of which the defendant is an officer. 44 The executive director shall not be considered a member of the board in determining the 45 venue of any such action, and no court shall have jurisdiction of any such action solely by 46 virtue of the executive director residing or maintaining a residence within its jurisdiction. 47 (f) The board shall give point credit to veterans in the same manner as required under Code 48 Sections 43-1-9 through 43-1-13. 49 (g) Initial judicial review of a final decision of the board shall be held solely in the 50 superior court of the county of domicile of the board. 51 (h) The executive director shall make a report no later than December 31 of each year 52 covering the activities of the board for that calendar year, which shall be made available to any member of the General Assembly upon request. 53 54 (i) The executive director shall prepare and maintain a public roster containing the names 55 and business addresses of all current licensees, registration holders, and permit holders for 56 each of the various registrants regulated by the board. A copy of the roster shall be 57 available to any person upon request at a fee prescribed by the board sufficient to cover the cost of printing and distribution. The following shall be treated as confidential, not subject 58 59 to Article 4 of Chapter 18 of Title 50, relating to inspection of public records, and shall not 60 be disclosed without the approval of the board:

61 (1) Applications and other personal information submitted by applicants, except to the

- applicant, the staff, and the board;
- 63 (2) Information, favorable or unfavorable, submitted by a reference source concerning
- an applicant, except to the staff and the board;
- 65 (3) Examination questions and other examination materials, except to the staff and the
- 66 board; and
- 67 (4) The deliberations of the board with respect to an application, an examination, a
- 68 complaint, an investigation, or a disciplinary proceeding, except as may be contained in
- official board minutes; provided, however, that such deliberations may be released to a
- 70 <u>law enforcement agency or prosecuting attorney of this state or to another state or federal</u>
- 71 <u>enforcement agency or lawful licensing authority.</u> Releasing the documents pursuant to
- 72 <u>this paragraph shall not subject any otherwise privileged documents to the provisions of</u>
- 73 Code Section 50-18-70.
- 74 (j) The executive director, with the approval of the board, notwithstanding any other
- 75 provisions of law to the contrary, shall enter into such contracts as are deemed necessary
- 76 to carry out this article to provide for all services required of the board.
- 77 (k) It shall be the duty of the executive director to keep minutes and a record of all acts of
- 78 the board and such other books and records as may be necessary to show the acts of the
- 79 <u>board."</u>

SECTION 3.

- 81 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-5, relating to general powers
- and responsibilities of the board, as follows:
- 83 "43-26-5.
- 84 (a) The board shall:
- 85 (1) Be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this chapter and shall be
- specifically granted all of the necessary duties, powers, and authority to carry out this
- 87 responsibility;
- 88 (2) Be authorized to draft, adopt, amend, repeal, and enforce such rules as it deems
- 89 necessary for the administration and enforcement of this chapter in the protection of
- public health, safety, and welfare;
- 91 (3) Enforce qualifications for licensure under this article or Article 2 or Article 4 of this
- 92 chapter;
- 93 (4) Develop and enforce reasonable and uniform standards for nursing education and
- 94 nursing practice;
- 95 (5) Periodically evaluate nursing education programs and approve such programs as meet
- 96 the board's requirements;

- 97 (6) Deny or withdraw approval from noncompliant nursing education programs;
- 98 (7) License duly qualified applicants under this article or Article 2 of this chapter by
- examination, endorsement, or reinstatement;
- 100 (8) Be authorized to issue temporary permits;
- 101 (9) Renew licenses of registered professional nurses, licensed undergraduate nurses, and
- licensed practical nurses in accordance with this article or Article 2 of this chapter;
- 103 (10) Be authorized to set standards for competency of licensees under this article or
- 104 Article 2 of this chapter continuing in or returning to practice;
- 105 (11) Set standards for and regulate advanced nursing practice;
- 106 (12) Be authorized to enact rules and regulations for registered professional nurses in
- their performing acts under a nurse protocol as authorized in Code Section 43-34-23 and
- enact rules and regulations for advanced practice registered nurses in performing acts as
- authorized in Code Section 43-34-25;
- 110 (13) Implement the disciplinary process;
- 111 (14) Be authorized to issue orders when a license under this article or Article 2 of this
- chapter is surrendered to the board while a complaint, investigation, or disciplinary action
- against such license is pending;
- 114 (15) Issue a limited license to practice nursing or licensed practical nursing subject to
- such terms and conditions as the board may impose;
- 116 (16) Provide consultation and conduct conferences, forums, studies, and research on
- nursing education and nursing practice;
- 118 (17) Approve the selection of a qualified person to serve as executive director;
- 119 (18)(17) Be authorized to appoint standing or ad hoc committees as necessary to inform
- and make recommendations to the board about issues and concerns and to facilitate
- communication amongst the board, licensees under this article or Article 2 of this chapter,
- and the community;
- 123 (19)(18) Maintain membership in the national organization which develops and regulates
- the nursing licensing examination and the practical nursing licensing examination;
- 125 (20)(19) Be authorized to collect data regarding existing nursing and licensed practical
- nursing resources in Georgia and coordinate planning for nursing education and nursing
- 127 practice;
- 128 $\frac{(21)(20)}{(21)}$ Determine fees;
- 129 (22)(21) Adopt a seal which shall be in the care of the executive director and shall be
- affixed only in such a manner as prescribed by the board;
- 131 $\frac{(23)(22)}{(23)}$ Be authorized to enforce all investigative and disciplinary orders issued by the
- former Georgia Board of Examiners of Licensed Practical Nurses;
- 133 (24)(23) Issue and renew multistate licenses pursuant to Article 4 of this chapter; and

134 (25)(24) Take any action with respect to a multistate license issued by this state pursuant to Article 4 of this chapter and with respect to the privilege to practice in this state under 135 a multistate license issued by another party state pursuant to the compact in Code Section 136 137 43-26-61 in the same manner as is authorized with respect to a license issued pursuant to this article or Article 2 of this chapter. 138 139 (b) The board shall be the sole professional licensing board for determining if a registered 140 professional nurse, licensed practical nurse, or any other person has engaged illegally in the practice of nursing. If a registered professional nurse or licensed practical nurse is 141 142 charged with the unauthorized practice of any other health profession by any other board, such board shall notify the Georgia Board of Nursing before conducting any hearing. 143 Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to limit any powers of any other board. 144 145 (c) Chapter 1 of this title is expressly adopted and incorporated by reference into this chapter as if all the provisions of such chapter were included in this chapter." 146

147 **SECTION 4.**

Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 43-26-39, relating to renewal of license,

continuing competency requirements, voluntary surrender, application for reinstatement, and

temporary permit, by revising subsection (a) as follows:

151 "(a) Licenses issued under this article shall be renewed biennially prior to the expiration

of the license according to schedules and fees decided by the board and approved by the

153 division director."

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154 **SECTION 5.**

155 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 43-26-40, relating to refusal to grant license,

revocation of license, and disciplining of licensees, by revising the introductory language of

157 subsection (a) as follows:

158 "(a) In addition to the authority granted grounds included in Code Section 43-1-19, the

board shall have the authority to refuse to grant a license to an applicant, to revoke the

license of a licensee, or to discipline a licensee upon a finding by the board that the

applicant or licensee has:"

162 **SECTION 6.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
